Amid contrasting claims, J&K Governor dissolves Assembly

Move follows PDP and PC seeking to form the government in the State

Jammu and Kashmir Governor Satya Pal Malik on Wednesday dissolved the State Assembly, as the Peoples Democratic Party (PDP) and the Peoples Conference (PC) separately staked claim to form a government after a day-long political drama.

“Governor Malik has passed an order in exercise of the powers conferred upon him by clause (b) of subsection (2) of Section 53 of the Constitution of Jammu and Kashmir to dissolve the Legislative Assembly,” read a Raj Bhavan communique.

Earlier, two parties, the PDP and the PC, after day-long political wrangling, wrote to the Raj Bhavan on

email and WhatsApp to stake claim to form the government, as they were unable to reach the Governor over fax.

Former Chief Minister and PDP president Mehbooba Mufti, in the letter, claimed that she had the support of 15 MLAs from the National Conference and 12 MLAs of the Congress, in addition to her 29 MLAs, putting the total number at 56. The Assembly has 87 members and

any party would require 44 MLAs' support to form a government. On the other hand, PC chief Sajad Lone, who has two MLAs, claimed the support of 25 MLAs of the BJP and of 18 more MLAs.

Mr. Malik is learnt to have conveyed to the Centre that the claims of the two groups were not convincing enough and could have led to instability.

A senior Home Ministry

official said the Centre planned to hold a fresh election in the State post the panchayat polls, which will end in December. However, the current developments expedited the move to dissolve the Assembly. Home Minister Rajnath Singh spoke to Mr. Malik and also apprised the PM of the developments.

“Bikramjit, an operative of the Khalistan Liberation Force (KLF), has given information indicating that the grenade was provided to the assailants by one Happy in Pakistan.

Birds flee devastated Pt. Calimere

After Cyclone Gaja struck, the wildlife sanctuary looks like a deserted war zone

Point Calimere, the renowned wildlife and bird sanctuary on the seashore in Nagapattinam district of Tamil Nadu, resembles a forest in Vietnam laid waste by Agent Orange.

In the devastation caused by Cyclone Gaja, hundreds of birds that once made the sanctuary their home have died, trees have been uprooted or their branches broken or defoliated. Carcasses of birds are found in some places.

Another bird sanctuary in Muthupet in Tiruvallur dis-

trict has also borne the brunt of the cyclone.

“There is widespread damage and 90% of the birds have deserted the sanctuaries. They could have migrated locally and will hopefully return. The trees have lost

their crown and it will take six months for them to revive themselves,” said C. Ramasubramaniam, Conservator of Forest, Nagapattinam district, under whose jurisdiction the sanctuary in Point Calimere falls.

“Around 2,000 birds were killed and the damage is also widespread in Muthupet,” said K. Arivoli, District Forest Officer, Tiruvallur.

Mr. Ramasubramaniam said 10 blackbuck and one spotted deer also died in the sanctuary after sea water entered it. It was closed as there is waist-deep water.

The Point Calimere sanctuary, covering 1728.81 hectares, is home to 564 flowering plants, 198 medicinal plants, 14 types of mammals, 18 reptiles and nine amphibians.

Communal clashes rock U.P. ahead of VHP meet

The festival of Milad-un-Nabi on Wednesday was marked by communal clashes in two districts of Uttar Pradesh, Mirzapur and Kanpur, as tension soared in these parts of the state ahead of the Vishwa Hindu Parishad's meeting in Ayodhya for construction of a Ram temple.

Prohibitory orders have been imposed in Mirzapur for over 24 hours. No serious injuries were, however, reported.

In Mirzapur, trouble started on Tuesday as members of two communities engaged in stone-pelting after a

minor dispute during a Ram-Janaki bike yatra taken out by the VHP through minority-populated areas.

Mirzapur District Magistrate Anurag Patel told *The Hindu* that the VHP did not have permission to hold the bike rally. The local SHO and two constables had been suspended for negligence, he said. No action has been taken against the VHP activists.

Additional SP Mirzapur Prakash Swaroop Pandey said five persons were arrested on the complaint of the VHP. Clashes were reported in Kanpur's Kalyanpur area too.

A miracle cure for Karnataka's ‘unwell’ policemen

Medical problems cited by police personnel to seek plum postings vanish after threat of ‘golden handshake’

It is not unusual for junior police personnel working with the Karnataka State Reserve Police (KSRP) to seek transfers to plum postings, citing health reasons. These requests are usually to units attached to Bengaluru's Central Business District (CBD). Things, however, came to a head when senior officials realised that 70% of the personnel who had sought transfers in recent months had given reasons ranging from diabetes and back pain to sinus problems and high

blood pressure.

Taking serious note of the spurt in applications, Bhaskar Rao, Additional Director General of Police, KSRP, issued a circular on November 19, stating that personnel applying for transfers without valid reasons would be forced to take compulsory retirement. This was enforceable under Rule 285 of the KSRP.

“Backaches are something that most of us suffer from. Also, diabetes cannot be a reason for seeking a transfer. Such transfer requests are

considered only if the person is suffering from a serious health problem and after he can show how the new posting would help

address his problem,” Mr. Rao said. “The reserve police force is a highly disciplined outfit, on a par with the Army. I cannot run it with sick people. We need to be fit and fine to defend the State, and candidates here are not recruited on compassionate grounds.”

Though it's early days, senior officials said they had received a flurry of requests from junior personnel seeking to withdraw their transfer applications.

A majority of the recruits are eyeing postings in the CBD area for purely

monetary reasons, said a senior official on the condition of anonymity. As the city police force is facing shortage of manpower, the Home Department had decided to use the KSRP to fill vacant posts.

While the circular has caused much consternation, Mr. Rao defended his decision. “We are not penalising anyone. It's like a ‘golden handshake’ to relieve sick personnel who cannot perform their duties for which they had received training. We can fill those posts with deserving candidates,” he said.

Odisha CM urges PM to halt Polavaram project construction

Seeks resolution of all pending issues; third letter to Centre in three years

Odisha Chief Minister Naveen Patnaik has urged Prime Minister Narendra Modi to cancel an order given the Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change for Polavaram project in July this year and stop construction of the project until all the pending issues are resolved.

‘Injury to Odisha interest’

“If the project is allowed to be completed before the resolution of all the pending issues, it will cause permanent injury to the interest of the State of Odisha and its people,” Mr. Patnaik wrote in a two-page letter sent to Mr. Modi on Wednesday.

“I am constrained to write

this letter to draw your personal attention and intervention on the magnitude of the consequences that the people of Odisha will have to face viz. the submergence of tribal villages resulting in mass displacement of tribals, the flooding of fertile

agricultural lands and submergence of large forest area, all of which can be avoided if only an opportunity is given for a final resolution of the disputes pending before the Supreme Court,” Mr. Patnaik said in his letter.

The Chief Minister has

suggested that the Polavaram project in Andhra Pradesh can be reformulated as per Godavari Water Dispute Tribunal, without causing large-scale submergence in the States of Odisha, Telangana and Chhattisgarh.

Mentioning that public hearing in Odisha has not been carried out till date, Mr. Patnaik said that a detailed study of design, flood and the studies related to backwater extent during floods will allow to make an assessment about the exact submergence in Odisha.

In his letter, Mr. Patnaik also mentioned that he has written three letters to the Prime Minister on the issue in the past – September 16, 2015, November 28, 2017, and July 12, 2018.

Cuttack accident: doctors, staff lauded for arresting death toll

10 passengers died, 42 were hurt when bus skidded off bridge

Gloom and sorrow engulfed the campus of Sriram Chandra Bhanj Medical College and Hospital here on Wednesday morning with crowds of grieving friends and relatives waiting to either take the bodies of their near and dear ones home or to be with them as they battled for their life following the deadly bus accident in the city on Tuesday evening.

At least 10 passengers died and 42 others were injured when the bus they were travelling in fell onto the Mahanadi riverbed after skidding off a bridge. The hospital provided free ambulances to carry the bodies to their respective villages.

“There has not been any increase in the death toll af-

ter the injured were given treatment here by a team of doctors drawn from 10 departments,” informed SCB Hospital emergency officer B.N. Moharana on Wednesday evening.

Odisha Governor Ganeshi Lal, Health Minister Pratap Jena and Transport Minister Nrusingha Sahu visited the hospital and expressed satis-

faction over the manner in which the doctors and paramedics acted during the initial crucial hours to arrest the death toll.

“We cannot bring back those who have left us but we will not allow anyone of the remaining to leave us,” the Governor said, lauding the efforts of the volunteers and the rescue workers.

3 held for abduction, rape of 8-year-old girl

Three burglars involved in kidnap and rape of an eight-year-old girl after committing theft at her house were arrested in Odisha's Ganjam district.

The accused – Kalia Patra, Mohan Topakul and Siba Kanmur, all from the same district – were tracked down and arrested on Tuesday night. According to police officers, they have confessed to committing the crime.

Ganjam Superintendent of Police Brijesh Kumar Ray said the trio had allegedly broken into the victim's house in Dhoyakana village around 2 a.m. on October 31 and stolen ₹20,000 cash as

well as gold and silver ornaments. On their way out, they took the girl, sleeping in her bedroom, with them and sexually assaulted her in a nearby paddy field.

Two special police teams had been formed to investigate the case. Later, a Special Investigation Team had been formed to monitor the developments in the investigation, the officer said.

Initial investigation suggests the three accused were involved in at least 11 incidents of burglary and theft in Ganjam district. Instruments used to break into houses and some stolen ornaments were seized from their possession, the police said.

Akshay appears before SIT in Kotkapura firing cases

Quizzed for 40 minutes

The Bollywood actor appeared before the SIT here and was questioned for over 40 minutes at the Police headquarters. Mr. Kumar was accompanied with his counsel Sant Pal Singh Sidhu, who later talking to journalists said "Akshay informed the SIT

that he has never met Gurmeet Ram Rahim and therefore the question of arranging any meeting between Mr. Sukhbir Badal and Gurmeet Ram Rahim at his residence

'Never met Sukhbir'

Mr. Sidhu added that Mr. Akshay also told the SIT

members that he had never met Mr. Sukhbir Badal outside Punjab.

Meanwhile, Shiromani Akali Dal termed the Akhaya Kumar's interrogation by the SIT as a "photo session".

'Sensationalising case'

Mahesh Inder Singh Grewal, senior vice-president and spokesperson of Akali Dal, said that Mr. Kumar was summoned only to "sensationalise" the case rather than finding any substantive evidence said.

"Mr. Akshay kumar does not have any direct connection with the case but was dragged in by the ruling Congress government to dramatise and to make the case sensational by summoning a top actor of Bollywood," he alleged.

After Tejashwi's protest, CCTV removed from CM's residence

RJD leader had claimed it was installed to snoop on him

After Leader of the Opposition in Bihar Assembly Tejashwi Yadav's furious protest against being snooped upon, the CCTV camera in question – installed on the rear boundary wall of Chief Minister Nitish Kumar's residence – was removed on Wednesday. The high-resolution CCTV camera, overlooking the adjoining official residence of Mr. Yadav, was placed on November 15.

The Rashtriya Janata Dal leader's 5, Deshratna Marg bungalow shares its boundary with the Chief Minister's 1, Anne Marg residence on one side.

Mr. Yadav had expressed outrage on social media over the mounting of the CCTV camera. The Bihar CM's residence is surrounded by arterial roads on three sides and

the Leader of the Opposition's residence on the fourth side, he said, but the CM felt the need for a CCTV camera "only on the wall bordering his political adversary's residence". Mr. Yadav had also used the incident to take a dig at Mr. Kumar's "obsession with luxury and grandeur" given his "self-proclaimed" austerity. "While Nitish Kumar and the police were well within their rights to ensure the security of the CM, they had

no right to peep into our bedrooms, the main entrance of the house, kitchen and residential office of my residence," he had added.

Later, the police said that the camera was installed in view of the "yearly security audit" of the Chief Minister's residence.

The ruling NDA leaders had slammed Mr. Yadav for raising objections to the installation of the camera. "He should not worry about the CCTV camera as it has not been put in his bedroom. He seems worried that criminals coming to meet him may get caught on the CCTV camera," Janata Dal (United) spokesperson Sanjay Singh had said. Sources close to the Chief Minister told *The Hindu* that he was not happy with the CCTV camera installation and had expressed his displeasure over it.

Two aides of prime accused remanded in CBI custody

Over sexual abuse of shelter home girls in Muzaffarpur

Two close aides of Brajesh Thakur, the prime accused in the Muzaffarpur shelter home case in which the girl inmates of the home were sexually abused, were remanded in a five-day CBI custody by a court here on Wednesday.

The special court hearing cases filed under the Protection of Children from Sexual Offences (POCSO) Act passed the order, declining the Central Bureau of Investigation's (CBI) request for a seven-day custody of Madhu and Ashwani Kumar - who allegedly posed as a doctor - and posted the matter to November 26 for further hearing.

Madhu, who was grilled by the police on Tuesday afternoon, was arrested on

Wednesday morning and made to undergo medical tests at the Sadar hospital, before being produced before the court, along with Ashwani, who was arrested the previous night.

Madhu, who handled many businesses of Thakur, had told reporters that she was not hiding but did not appear before the probe agency as she was never named as an accused nor was a warrant issued against her.

'Privy to no secrets'

She had also claimed that she knew nothing about the goings on at the Balika Grih (shelter home for girls), was "privy to no secrets" and refuted the media reports that she used to liaison with influential people to promote Thakur's NGOs, newspapers and other businesses.

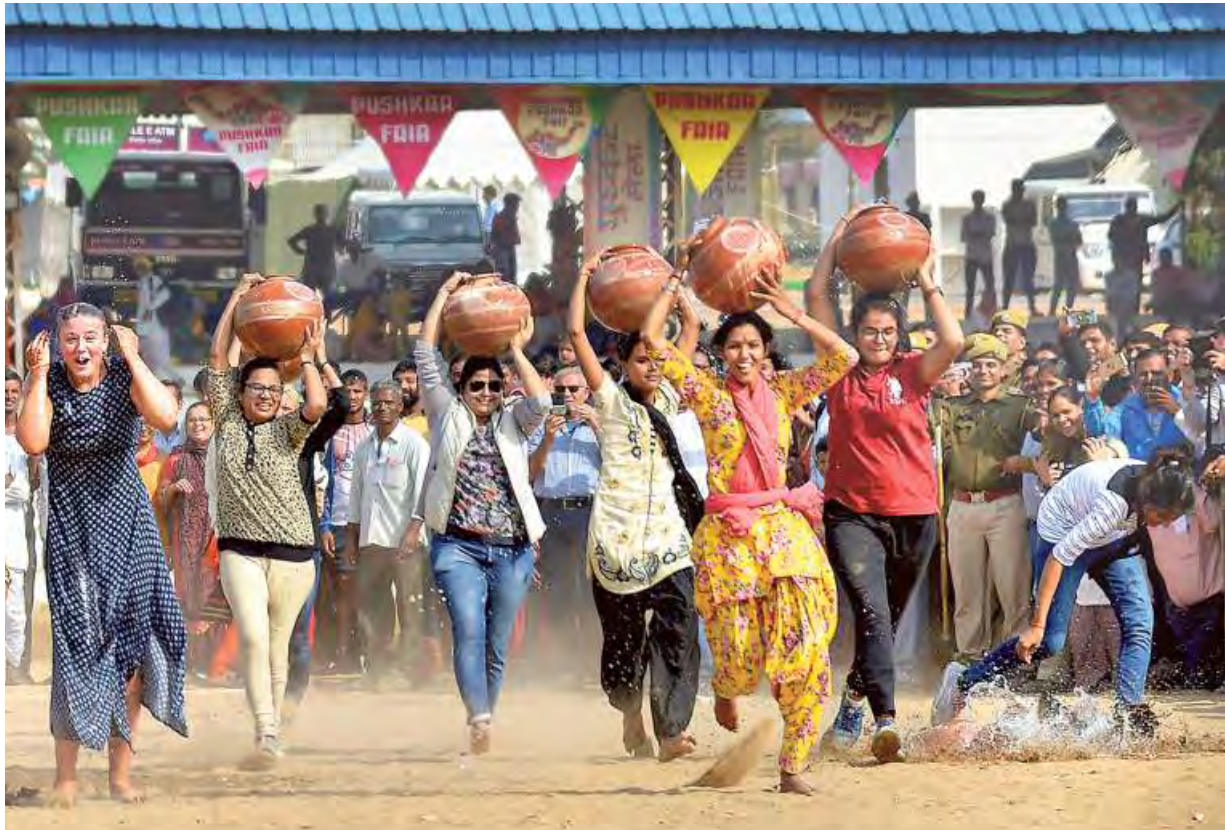
Kumar, who was arrested from his in-laws place in Fatehpur village under the Kurhni police station in the district, did not have any medical background.

He learnt how to administer injections while sitting in the clinic of his father, a doctor, at Kurhani, about 30 km from Muzaffarpur town.

He was associated with Thakur's NGO "Sewa Sankalp Aur Vikas Samiti" and allegedly used to administer injections laced with sedatives to the shelter home inmates before they were subjected to sexual abuse, sources close to Kumar said.

A number of people have so far been arrested in connection with the high-profile scandal, which came to light following a social audit of Bihar shelter homes by Tata Institute of Social Sciences.

Probe panel submits findings to State Home Secretary

Jalandhar Divisional Commissioner B. Purusharthia, who was appointed special executive magistrate by the government to probe the October 19 accident, said the report was submitted to Punjab Home Secretary N. S. Kalsi.

The report had statements of over 150 people. They included railway officials and Punjab Minister Navjot Singh Sidhu's wife Navjot Kaur Sidhu, who was the chief guest at the Dussehra event, held close to the railway tracks in Amritsar.

The report would now be examined by the Home De-

partment, a senior official said.

organisers.

BJP wins 5 mayoral seats in Uttarakhand

Civic polls in the State sprang a surprise with Independents grabbing 23 posts

The BJP has won five of the seven mayoral seats and 34 of the 84 chairman and president posts in the Uttarakhand civic polls, while Independents sprang a surprise by grabbing 23 posts.

Results for one post is yet to be declared, it said.

The civic body poll was a high-stake battle for the ruling BJP that was looking to match its own impressive showing in the Uttarakhand elections last year when it had won 57 out of 70 assembly seats.

It was also significant for the Congress that has been struggling to stage a comeback after its defeat in the Assembly polls.

The BJP won five of the se-

Mulayam's son Akhilesh, brother Shivpal gear up to celebrate his 80th birthday, seek blessings

Samajwadi Party founder Mulayam Singh could find himself in a dilemma of choosing between son Akhilesh and brother Shivpal, both of whom will be celebrating his 80th birthday separately on Thursday and seek his "blessings" ahead of the Lok Sabha polls.

The uncle and nephew parted ways in 2016 after Akhilesh removed Shivpal as the SP's State president and last year, a national conven-

tion nominated the former Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister as party head replacing Mulayam.

Shivpal Yadav's Pragatish-eel Samajwadi Party-Lohia (PSPL) has planned State-wide celebrations, including events at the party's office at 6, Lal Bahadur Shastri Marg, here and Saifai, the native place of the Yadav clan, in Etawah.

The Akhilesh Yadav-led Samajwadi Party (SP), which has also planned to celebrate Mulayam's birthday across

the State, will have an event at its office in the Uttar Pradesh capital.

The PSPL has decided to celebrate his birthday as "Dharm Nirpekshta Diwas"

and organise a 'dangal' (wrestling event) in Saifai as Mulayam was a wrestler once and known for his skills in the ring.

"We will be celebrating the day as Dharm Nirpekshta Diwas (secularism day) as 'netaji' (as Mulayam is fondly called) is the one who stood against communal forces with full force.

"The objective of the day will be to strengthen social amity and ideology of secularism," Shivpal's son and PSPL general secretary Adi-

tya Yadav said.

The Samajwadi Party is not far behind as it has also announced State-wide celebrations like those of previous years and asked its district officials and workers to organise events.

"The SP has asked its district and city cadre to celebrate Mulayam Singh Yadav's birthday. We have been organising his birthday earlier also. He is not only our party's founder but also a samajwadi icon," SP spokesperson Rajendra Chaudhary said.

Opposition raises questions over success of Jalyukta Shivar scheme

Congress calls the scheme a failure for using more tankers despite more rainfall; check facts, says BJP

The Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP)-led State government has come under the scanner for the efficiency of its flagship Jalyukta Shivar scheme with the Opposition claiming that despite higher percentage of rainfall in 2018, in comparison with the previous years, the number of water tankers currently deployed has increased.

In 2014, Maharashtra received 70.2% rainfall and total number of tankers deployed in the week beginning November 17, 2014, was 71. In 2015, the state received 59.4% rainfall and as per the data from Water Supplies and Sanitation department the number of

tankers deployed in the corresponding week was 693. The implementation of the Jalyukta Shivar gained momentum after that. In 2018,

the State has received total rainfall of 74.4% but as of November 17, 2018 the total number of tankers used stands at 715.

“These numbers raise a serious question over the Jalyukta Shivar scheme, for which the government has been claiming a grand success. The scheme is aimed at storing water at the village level and increasing ground water content. If those aims are fulfilled, why is the number of tankers being deployed in the state is increasing?” asked Congress spokesperson Sachin Sawant. He said that the government has spent over ₹7,000 crore on the scheme.

“If the scheme is not turning out to be useful then inquiry must be held on the quality of work. Where has the money gone? There should be a judicial inquiry into this scam,” he said.

Replying to the allegations, BJP said that the Congress is misleading the people and should instead look at the number of tankers from May, as it is the month with the highest scarcity of water. Party spokesperson Keshav Upadhye said the number of tankers used in October-November can vary as many places in the State get retreating monsoon showers.

“During Congress rule in 2013, a total of 2,322 tankers were used in May despite 109% rainfall. On the contrary in 2017, despite 84% rainfall only 1,047 tankers were deployed. Congress leaders should check their facts instead of making baseless allegations,” he said.

Pune residents oppose compulsory helmet rule

Attempts to implement this have failed at least thrice before

The Pune City police's much-publicised directive making helmets compulsory from January 1 next year has met with opposition from citizens, activists and politicians cutting across party lines who have joined hands to form the 'anti-helmet compulsion action committee'.

Members of this committee vehemently opposed Pune Police Commissioner K. Venkatesham's recent decision to enact the provisions of Sections 128 and 129 of the Motor Vehicles (MV) Act, 1988 that make wearing of helmets by two-wheeler users mandatory.

Rising deaths
Mr. Venkatesham said the decision follows increasing number of fatalities among two-wheeler riders – 211 so far this year, and 195 in 2017.

“This compulsory enforcement of the helmet rule, attempted a number of times before in Pune – in December 2001, 2004, and again in 2011-12 – ended in failure each time. One reason is that for every new police chief taking charge, the helmet rule is often the easiest to implement, like a showpiece achievement,” noted RTI activist Vivek Velankar, told *The Hindu*.

Mr. Velankar, founder of the ‘Sajag Nagrik Manch’, called the move “thoughtless” and “absurd” as it did not take into account the appalling condition of the city's roads and the placement of arbitrary speed-breakers which aggravate road accidents.

“The authorities are completely apathetic about

the state of the roads, yet they are hell-bent on imposing this rule. Instead of addressing ‘category A’ traffic offences like lane-cutting, overspeeding, or driving from the wrong side, they are focusing on helmets,” he said.

Maximum two-wheelers
With more than 24 lakh two-wheelers, the city boasts the maximum numbers in the country.

A deplorable transport system has ensured the presence of more two-wheelers in the ever-burgeoning city which is continually in the throes of traffic snarls.

“Given Pune's traffic congestion, one cannot exceed speeds of 25 km/hr on any of the main roads. Plus, there is the question of physical ailments like spondylitis occurring as a result of driving with helmets for a long time in a city where traffic jams have become the norm,” said Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) leader Ankush Kakade.

Those opposing the move have also questioned the quality of helmets being

manufactured. “There is bound to be a scramble for helmets before January 1. There aren't enough ISI-certified helmets being manufactured in the country to satisfy Pune's requirements. The police commissioner's rash decision will only spawn an entire market of spurious helmets,” Mr. Velankar observed.

Meanwhile, in the first phase, the police began cracking the whip on government officials found driving without helmets.

‘Not for revenue’
Joint Commissioner of Police, Shivaji Bodkhe, clarified that the intent of the city police is not revenue garnering, as alleged by those opposing the compulsory helmet rule.

“It is natural that there will be some opposition. But we are organising sensitisation drives, not only in government offices, but also in private companies to urge employers to convince their staff of the benefits of using a helmet,” Mr. Bodkhe told *The Hindu*.

NIA court refuses to share names

A National Investigation Agency (NIA) court on Wednesday rejected a plea by Lieutenant Colonel Prasad Purohit, an accused in the Malegaon 2008 blasts, seeking names of witnesses in the trial.

On November 12, Mr. Purohit had filed two applications – one stating that the NIA has not submitted names of all witnesses in the trial, and that truncated information was shared with him. However, the NIA counsel Avinash Rasal objected to it and said since the matter is sensitive, names cannot be shared.

Complaint against Raj Bhavan for delay in reply to RTI application

Activist had sought details of Goa Governor's tours

Right to Information (RTI) activist Advocate Aires Rodrigues on Wednesday filed a complaint with the Goa State Information Commission (GSIC) against Goa Raj Bhavan for not furnishing information sought by him.

The Public Information Officer (PIO) and the Secretary to the Goa Governor have been named respondents in the complaint.

In his October 19 application to the PIO at Raj Bhavan, Mr. Rodrigues had sought information on details of official and unofficial tours and trips within India and over-

seas by the Governor and her family from the day she assumed office on August 31, 2014, and the total expenditure incurred on each visit.

Mr. Rodrigues had further sought details of guests including VIPs, VVIPs and others who stayed at Raj Bhavan since August 31, 2014 and the expenditure incurred on each guest. He also sought details of vehicles purchased for Raj Bhavan since August 31, 2014.

In his complaint filed on Wednesday, Mr. Rodrigues has pointed out that though the mandated time of 30 days, as specified in the RTI Act, has elapsed Raj Bhavan

has not furnished the information sought by him nor has responded to his application.

He has sought that Raj Bhavan be directed to furnish the information immediately and penalty be imposed on Raj Bhavan under Section 20 of the RTI Act.

Earlier, while disposing another petition filed by Mr. Rodrigues, The Goa Chief Information Commissioner had on October 15 upheld the orders of the Commission that the Governor's secretariat of Goa Raj Bhavan is a public authority and comes within the purview of the RTI Act.

12 die in two road accidents

Don't stop genuine pilgrims in Sabarimala, HC tells police

'Prohibitory orders do not apply to mantra chanting'

SPECIAL CORRESPONDENT KOCHI

A Division Bench of the Kerala High Court directed the police not to prevent genuine pilgrims, individually or in groups, from proceeding to Sabarimala and chanting Sarana mantras.

The Bench comprising Justice P.R. Ramachandra Menon and Justice N. Anil Kumar made it clear that the prohibitory orders issued under Section 144 of the Criminal Procedure Code would not stand in the way of the genuine pilgrims proceeding to Sabarimala and also chanting of Sarana mantras.

The court, however, added that if anybody breached peace, it was up to the police to identify the violators and take appropriate action against them. The court directed the State government to produce the files, including police re-

ports, leading to the issue of prohibitory orders.

The Bench passed the order on two writ petitions challenging the validity of the prohibitory orders issued by the Pathanamthitta and Kottayam district collectors at Sabarimala and its adjoining areas.

When the petitions were taken up for hearing, the court orally observed that the fact that a group of 110 pilgrims, including 33 children, from Mumbai had to return without having dar-

shan pointed to the sad state of affairs at Sabarimala. This was perhaps because the excessive restrictions had created fear in their minds.

The court orally observed that it had occasion to see that the police was waking up sleeping pilgrims and sending them out at Sabarimala.

The court said that the police were not abiding by the oral directives of the High Court not to prevent pilgrims from using the 'Nadappanthal'.

Pon. Radhakrishnan flays police, administration

Union Minister of State for Finance and Shipping Pon. Radhakrishnan, who was on his annual pilgrimage to the Ayyappa temple on Wednesday, came down heavily on the "unnecessary and avoidable restrictions imposed on the pilgrims" by the police and the administration at Sabarimala. Mr. Radhakrishnan alleged "arrogance" by a police official who had an argument with him over movement of vehicles to Pampa.

BJP leader K. Surendran, 71 others granted bail

'First photo' of Ortolan Bunting in India is out

The bird was photographed near Mangaluru

In a rare sighting that has been photographed, birder K. Vivek Nayak from Mangaluru captured through his lens the 'Ortolan Bunting', which breeds from Mongolia to Europe and migrates to Africa via the Middle East.

Mr. Nayak, from Coastal

Karnataka Birdwatchers' Network, told *The Hindu* that he spotted the bird at Kenjar, on the outskirts of the city, on Sunday (November 18) at about 4.15 p.m.

'First photo in India'

"The bird was drinking water in a marshy field," he said. After Mr. Nayak shared the spotting of the bird and its photograph on social media, some birders commented that it is the first photographic record of an Ortolan

bunting in India.

Praveen J. from Bird Count India, a consortium of several groups of birders across India, told *The Hindu*: "It is the definitive photograph from India."

Mr. Praveen said that the bird appears to be 'disoriented', and it is a young one. While migrating, if an Ortolan bunting loses its way, it may land anywhere, he said.

The International Union for Conservation of Nature's (IUCN) red list of threatened

species has placed Ortolan bunting in the "Least Concern" category.

'Wonderful sighting'

Shivashankar, a birder and the co-author of the book, 'Birds of Southern Coastal Karnataka', wrote: "Wonderful sighting of Ortolan bunting at Mangaluru by Vivek." Another birder Prashantha Krishna M.C. wrote: "This one is the first confirmed photographic record for India."

Debt-ridden farmer found dead in Jhajjar district

District administration orders probe into November 16 death

ASHOK KUMAR JHAJJAR
Prakash Punia, 50, had a two-acre plot and sown another six acres on contract, but the land was inundated with rainwater in mid-September damaging the entire crop. He had an unpaid loan of ₹3 lakh, including over ₹1 lakh interest for non-payment.

Prakash had borrowed around ₹90,000 for a trolley and ₹1 lakh through Kisan Credit Card for crops from Sarva Haryana Gramin Bank's Silani Branch nine years ago. He had taken six acres on contract for ₹90,000 this season hoping to make some profit to prepare for his daughter's wedding.

But destiny had a different plan for him.

On November 15, he left home after a morning meal. The next evening, he was found dead, having taken his own life.

"He was perturbed for the past few days. Both our children are of marriageable age, but we are reeling under financial crisis due to crop failure. He had also got several notices from the bank recently to repay the outstanding amount adding to his anxiety," recalled Prakash's wife Suresh, their daughter Preeti, a Hindi postgraduate, beside her. They also have a son, Sachin.

Prakash's nephew Satbir said that several hundred acres in Khudan and neighbouring villages, including Haryana Agriculture Minister O.P. Dhankar's native village Dhakla, were inundated due to heavy rains in September causing massive damage to crops in the region. "Despite the Haryana

Farmers a worried lot

Forty-year-old Jaibir and his brothers at Khudan village here had together borrowed ₹5 lakh through the Kisan Credit Cards for the kharif crop this year. But they lost around 70% of the crop, mostly paddy and bajra, due to waterlogging in their farms after heavy rain in September.

Mr. Jaibir is worried as to how he would repay the loan, the first instalment of which is due in December. "If I fail to pay the instalment, the interest rate would increase from 6% to 16%. But I have no choice. Of the around 12-acre land, we brothers have lost 70% crop in seven acres," he said.

Most of the farmers in his village and the neighbouring villages met the same fate.

Nau Ratan Pradhan, 72, chipped in saying that almost 80% land in their village was inundated with rainwater and more than 100 acres could not be pre-

pared even for the rabi crop.

"Another 200 acres would also get considerably delayed for the sowing of rabi crop," he lamented.

The rain came at a time when the crop was just a few weeks away from being harvested.

Mr. Pradhan said after repeated requests, the district administration arranged for a pump set to drain out the water, but the pipes were found leaking. "It has been more than two months, but still the fields are inundated," he said. "No one wants to take his

life, but Prakash took the extreme step forced by financial crisis," said 73-year-old ex-serviceman Krishan Singh.

None of the villagers, however, has taken the crop insurance under the Pradhan Mantri Fasal Bima Yojana. "We are an illiterate people. We don't know the procedure to take crop insurance," he said.

Prakash's brother Pradeep Kumar said that Prasan, a fellow villager, had taken crop insurance last year, but did not get claim for the failure of his nine-acre crop.

government announcing to pump out water by October 27, nothing happened. The prospects of many farmers in this region to sow rabi crop are also bleak," he said.

'Waive off loan'
Farmers' leader Shamsher Singh demanded that Haryana government waive off the outstanding loan to the deceased, provide financial help to his family, and give a government job to the son. He also sought registration

of an abetment-to-suicide case against the officials concerned responsible for pumping out the water. Mr. Singh sought making public the figures on the farmers' deaths in Haryana since 2016. He claimed that another farmer owning ten acres had died by suicide the previous month in the district.

Deputy Commissioner, Jhajjar, Sonal Goel, told *The Hindu* that a probe by Sub-Divisional Magistrate (Jhaj-

jar) had been ordered. She claimed that Jhajjar was one of the best performing districts in dealing with the crisis arising out of heavy rains and only a few low-lying areas remained waterlogged.

Superintending Engineer, Irrigation, Ramesh Kumar said most of the water in Khudan was pumped out, but the farmers were not willing to give passage to drain out the remaining water causing an impasse.

Nothing new in youngsters joining ULFA-I: Sarma

Assam Finance Minister Himanta Biswa Sarma said on Wednesday that there was nothing new in youngsters from the State joining the proscribed ULFA (Independent) and sought to underplay the outfit's "commander-in-chief" Parash Baruah's nephew joining it.

He attacked former Chief Minister Tarun Gogoi for saying that many youngsters from Assam had joined the ULFA(I) during the present Bharatiya Janata Party government's rule in the State and wondered whether those arrested for being members of the outfit during the Congress regime were "fake".

Nothing new

"There is nothing new in youngsters joining the ULFA(I). Every year, 150-200 youngsters join the outfit. If a journalist joins the insurgent group, it can be considered as a new information," Mr. Sarma said on the sidelines of a BJP meeting.

On the issue of Mr. Baruah's nephew Munna joining the outfit, he said: "There is nothing surprising about ULFA(I) chief's nephew joining the outfit. If he (Munna) does not join the ULFA(I), then who will? Is that news?"

Taking a swipe at the Congress to which Mr. Gogoi belongs, Mr. Sarma, who is also the convener of the North East Democratic Alliance consisting of the BJP and regional parties, said: "Like the Congress, the ageing Parash Baruah too chose his own blood as his heir to take forward his mission."

Andhra Pradesh Chief Minister N. Chandrababu Naidu has net assets worth ₹2.99 crore while his three-year-old grandson Nara Devaansh is richer with assets worth ₹18.71 crore in his name.

Mr. Naidu's son and Information Technology Minister Nara Lokesh declared the family's assets at a press conference on Wednesday.

Mr. Lokesh's assets shot up to ₹21.40 crore from ₹15.21 crore last year.

The value of Mr. Naidu's assets rose by just ₹25.41 crore compared to last year while his debt burden reduced from ₹5.64 crore to ₹5.31 crore on a housing loan.

The new house he built in Jubilee Hills, Hyderabad, has been valued at ₹8.96 crore against ₹7.75 crore last year.

Mr. Naidu's wife Bhuvaneshwari is the richest member of the family with net assets worth ₹31.01 crore, which rose from ₹25.41 crore last year. Her "liabilities" too increased from ₹20.90 crore to ₹22.35 crore during the year.

Mr. Lokesh's wife Brahmani saw her assets decline by half to ₹7.72 crore from ₹15.01 crore last year. Her liabilities shot up from ₹36.14 lakh to ₹5.66 crore. Their son Devaansh grew richer by over ₹7 crore this year with his assets touching ₹18.71 crore compared to ₹11.54 crore last year.

Navy makes formal request for multi-role U.S. copters

The deal is estimated to be worth \$2 billion

NEW DELHI

India made a formal request to the U.S. for the purchase of 24 MH-60R Multi-Role Helicopters (MRH) for the Navy in a deal estimated at \$2bn. This is among a series of defence procurements and inductions from the U.S. and Russia in the last two months.

"The Government issued the Letter of Request (LoR) on November 15 for procurement of 24 MRH from the U.S. government under the Foreign Military Sales (FMS) route," a defence official said.

The Navy is presently facing a critical shortage of helicopters and several frontline warships are plying with empty helicopter decks. These helicopters are

being procured as replacement for 15 Sea King ASW helicopters de-inducted from service in 1991 and one Sea King 42B MRH lost in accident. The current MRHs in service, Sea King 42Bs, were inducted in the 1980s.

In August, ahead of the inaugural India-US 2+2 dialogue, the Defence Acquisition Council (DAC) accorded the Acceptance of Necessity (AoN) for the procurement.

The LoR was signed and sent after the Navy received the pricing and availability details from the U.S. Now the U.S. will get back with the price quote, following which contract negotiations would begin to conclude the final deal. As the deal is through the FMS route, the process is expected to be completed in a short time-frame.

Given the urgency for helicopters, the U.S. is likely to

take some MH-60R helicopters off the flight deck of their newest aircraft carrier USS Gerald Ford. In July, the USS Gerald Ford went for year-long upgrades and fixes. "We will likely get about 4-5 MH-60s from the Gerald Ford immediately once the deal is signed," the official said. All the helicopters would be delivered in a phased manner from 2020-24.

No bias in probe into FCRA cases, Centre tells HC

Complaint against Nitin Gadkari also under investigation, says MHA; seeks substantial evidence, if any

The Ministry of Home Affairs has told the Delhi High Court that the government is probing without any bias all allegations of violation of the foreign contribution regulation law, including a complaint of alleged contravention of FCRA against Union Transport Minister Nitin Gadkari.

The Ministry's affidavit filed before a Bench of Chief Justice Rajendra Menon and Justice V.K. Rao came on a public interest litigation petition seeking setting up of a body or tribunal indepen-

dent of political executive for enforcement of the Foreign Contribution Regulation Act (FCRA), 2010.

NGO's claim

An NGO, Association of Democratic Reforms (ADR), in its petition filed in 2015 mentioned that one of its members had made a complaint of FCRA violation against Mr. Gadkari on February 27, 2015, and no action had been taken.

The Ministry, in its response, said, "In the case of complaint against Nitin Gadkari, the same is under inves-

tigation and the petitioner [ADR] has also been requested to provide substantial evidence, if any."

The Ministry said the present system of administering the FCRA was "efficient, just and fair and there is no need for establishing any independent body or tribunal for enforcing it."

It said the setting up of a body or tribunal for enforcement of FCRA would require an amendment of the statute, which was in the domain of the legislature and not the judiciary.

The Ministry further said

the NGO had not mentioned any instances of abuse of the foreign contribution regulation law in its petition. Terminating the petition "motivated," the Ministry had sought dismissal of the plea.

The Ministry said that so far it had cancelled the FCRA registration of 18,867 NGOs for violating provisions of the Act.

'Misuse of Act'

Advocate Prashant Bhushan, who is representing the NGO, has contended that the FCRA was misused in several cases. He argued that the executive

Rule now applies to non-ECR category

Passport holders with "non-Emigration Check Required (non-ECR)" status will soon have to get themselves registered with the Ministry of External Affairs before taking up jobs abroad.

The rule, which takes effect on January 1, is said to be aimed at the welfare of Indians going abroad. It applies to jobs in 18 countries, including the six Gulf Cooperation Council nations, which have the largest number of expats.

Category of passengers

The non-ECR category of passengers include Indians paying income tax and those with educational qualification above matriculation. As of now only ECR category passport holders were required to get emigration clearance from the office of

the Protector of Emigrants to seek employment abroad. All those seeking employment will have to register online via the website www.emigrate.gov.in. Those failing to register at least 24 hours prior to actual departure will be off-loaded at the airports.

For all other visa categories, there is no change in existing procedures.

Officials say the objective of the directive is to protect workers with higher educational qualification from not getting into blue collar jobs. Previously only ECR stamped passport holders had to go through the mandatory e-migrate registration since 2015.

SC to review death penalty in 2009 case

The Supreme Court has decided to review a 2013 judgment by which a Tamil Nadu man was condemned to death for the kidnap and murder of a seven-year-old boy.

The boy was the only brother to three sisters.

The February 2013 judgment had reasoned that the boy's death caused "unfathomable grief" to the parents. The boy would have carried further the family lineage and seen his parents through their old age, the court had observed, justifying the death penalty.

Last week, on November 12, a Bench of Justices Kurian Joseph, A.M. Khanwilkar and D.Y. Chandrachud decided to review the 2013 verdict against the convict, Sundararajan, represented by advocate Ranjith Marar. The review petition would be heard afresh in open court. The three-judge Bench has called for the records of the case. The court said his execution would be stayed till further orders.

The crime dates back to 2009 when the victim on his way to school was accosted by the convict. The prosecution version is that the convict told the boy that his mother and grandmother were unwell. Witnesses said the boy was last seen alive getting on to the motorbike of the convict.

On the basis of a complaint filed by the boy's mother, an FIR was registered by the police. The same day, the mother received a call for a ransom of ₹5 lakh. The mother rushed to the police. Its team apprehended the convict and another person from his house. The convict admitted that the boy was strangled when ransom was not paid.

A fatal entry into no-entry zone

Fishermen saw a body being buried on the shore, it looked like Chau's: police

John Allen Chau, the American national allegedly killed by people belonging to the protected Sentinelese tribe in the North Sentinel Island, had hired fishermen to take him there clandestinely, Dendra Pathak, DGP, Andaman and Nicobar Police said on Wednesday.

"They started on November 14 around 8 p.m. and reached by midnight. The next day, Mr. Chau moved to shore using his kayak which he got towed with the fishing boat. After dropping him, the fishermen fixed their timings and place to meet each other.

"In the morning of November 17, they saw a dead person being buried at the shore which from the silhouette of the body, clothing and circumstances appeared to be the body of Mr. Chau," a press release said.

They returned to Port Blair and narrated the incident to local electronics engineer Alexander, who had arranged for the transport, and handed him the 13 pages of the journal written by Mr. Chau.

Mr. Alexander informed Bobby Parks, a friend of Mr. Chau in the U.S., who informed his mother. His mother informed the U.S. Consulate, which alerted the police on November 19.

The DGP said access to North Sentinel Island and its buffer zone is strictly restricted under the Protection of Aboriginal Tribe (Regulation), 1956 and Regulations under Indian Forest Act, 1927. All the seven people who helped Mr. Chau were, therefore, booked and arrested in a case for violating the provisions of the PAT Regulations, the release said. A case of murder has also been registered against anonymous persons, it said.

Justice, 34 years on

The conviction of two men offers a glimmer of hope to other victims of the anti-Sikh pogrom

The conviction of two rioters for their role in the 1984 anti-Sikh violence in Delhi marks a rare success in the long struggle to bring the perpetrators to justice. Of particular significance is that this case, relating to a mob attack on shop-keepers in Mahipalpur, was resurrected after being closed as ‘untraced’ in 1994. The attack with deadly weapons left two Sikhs dead and three wounded. The Central government’s decision in 2015 to form a Special Investigation Team (SIT) to reopen serious cases related to the 1984 riots has yielded results. Yashpal Singh, a goods transporter, has now been sentenced to death, and Naresh Sehrawat, the local postman when the mob attack took place, to life. The trial court has rightly brushed aside minor discrepancies in evidence and technical objections to the fresh investigation being taken up, and concluded that the testimony of key witnesses, who were themselves injured, was cogent and reliable. It is possible to argue that there is little justice, or even meaning, in securing the conviction of those who may have been sucked into the mob frenzy that followed Indira Gandhi’s assassination. However, it cannot be forgotten that obtaining a conviction in instances of communal and sectarian riots is quite rare. Investigators and prosecutors seldom succeed in nailing political leaders and their key henchmen. Impunity for participants in pogroms has been the norm, and successful prosecution the rare exception. The last time a person involved in the anti-Sikh riots was sentenced to death was in 1996. But Kishori Lal, known as ‘the butcher of Trilokpuri’, managed to get his death sentence commuted to life.

Investigation into the 1984 riot cases has been severely hampered by the fact that large sections of the police connived with the rioters, who included Congress functionaries and supporters. The slow judicial process was made even more excruciating by manipulated investigation and shoddy prosecution. In this very case, a long-time Congress functionary, Jai Pal Singh, had been tried and acquitted by a magistrate’s court as early as in 1986. However, the witnesses who identified Naresh and Yashpal among the 800-odd rioters at Mahipalpur, had once again said Jai Pal Singh was a prominent participant in the attack. This is just one instance of how influential men have managed to evade the law. An appeal challenging the acquittal of Congress leader Sajjan Kumar is in the Delhi High Court. Apart from the cases that have been reopened by the government-appointed SIT, the Supreme Court constituted a team to investigate 186 cases. The latest verdict demonstrates that the efflux of years need not be an impediment to the project of securing justice. It offers a glimmer of hope for substantial justice despite the passage of 34 years.

War without end?

The horrific attack in Kabul must prompt greater momentum in peace talks

The attack on a religious gathering in Kabul that killed 55 people, including several scholars and clerics, is another signal of Afghanistan’s descent into chaos. The clerics had gathered to mark the birth anniversary of Prophet Mohammed when the suicide bomber blew himself up. The Taliban denied responsibility and blamed the attack on “seditionary circles”, alluding to the Islamic State. Given the manner of the attack, it could well be responsible. In June, the IS had claimed an attack on another gathering of clerics. In Afghanistan the group has carried out a series of attacks on Shia religious gatherings and mosques. Hardline Sunnis consider venerating the Prophet’s birthday sacrilegious, making the clerical gathering a target for extremists such as the IS. But beyond the specific reasons behind the attack, the fact that a major religious gathering in the Afghan capital can be so easily assaulted by terrorists is worrying. Despite repeated promises by the government, the security situation has deteriorated, and markedly. Afghan forces face a war on two fronts. One is with the Taliban, which is mostly attacking government offices and soldiers. The other is with the IS, which is targeting civilians, minorities and clerics. It is almost certain, after 17 years of war, that the government cannot stabilise the country using force.

This stalemate has prompted the Afghan government and its international backers to look for ways other than war to find a solution to the conflict. The U.S. has already appointed a special envoy to Afghanistan, Zalmay Khalilzad. He has held talks with Taliban representatives in Doha. Russia has also stepped into the peace process by hosting an international conference in Moscow, in which both Taliban and Afghan representatives participated. These attempts are actually exploring the possibility of a peace deal between the Taliban and the Afghan government to end the insurgency. It is not going to be easy. The Taliban insists on international troops being withdrawn from Afghanistan as a precondition and wants changes in the Afghan Constitution. The government wants the Taliban to accept the Constitution, while the Americans say a troops pullout is not a matter of discussion with the Taliban. Still, the Taliban has made it clear that it is ready for talks, which is in itself a change given the group’s approach towards the conflict. It had, for the first time, agreed to a brief ceasefire with government forces around Id earlier this year. The reason is that the Taliban realises that it cannot win the war, at least not as long as the U.S. supports the government. It is also facing heat from the IS. The question is whether the government can seize the moment, strengthen its own counter-insurgency measures and negotiate from a position of strength, with backing from international actors. It’s indeed a tall ask.

The RBI concedes a vital principle

Its openness to the board discussing all policy decisions may well be a paradigm shift

The angel was in the detail of the terse press note that the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) issued after the meeting of its board of directors on November 19. Every one of the four decisions taken, including three decisions related to regulation, was ascribed to the board. The note also mentions that the constitution of a committee to examine the economic capital framework of the RBI, which was one of the decisions taken, will be jointly determined by the RBI and the Government of India.

These announcements constitute a significant departure from what has appeared to be the position of the RBI thus far: policy decisions, especially those relating to regulation, are the exclusive province of RBI management. Any departure from this position amounts to an infringement of the RBI’s autonomy.

The government and some of the current nominee directors on the RBI board have contended that all policy decisions must be deliberated by the board. The outcomes of the November 19 meeting suggest that the RBI has conceded this vital principle. This augurs well for the relationship between the government and the RBI management hereafter. Indeed, it may well constitute a paradigm shift in the functioning of the RBI.

A grey area

The precise relationship between the RBI board and the RBI man-

agement is something of a grey area. Various experts have made the point that the RBI Act vests all powers in the board and, concurrently, it vests those very powers in the RBI Governor. Whether the board can issue directions to the RBI Governor in the event of a difference of opinion between the two is not clear; some experts reject the suggestion outright.

Many contend that the RBI board has played an advisory role in the past and should continue to do so. Well, corporate boards too play an advisory role for the most part even though they enjoy full powers in the running of the corporation. They tend to leave most decisions to management. However, corporate boards do step in and play a more active role where management is found wanting.

Surely, this applies to the RBI board as well? It can be nobody’s case that the statute has conferred powers on the RBI board that were never meant to be exercised. Let us accept that these powers should be exercised rarely. Let us grant that the RBI board must play a largely advisory role. Even so, it is legitimate to expect that all policy matters would be deliberated by the board. The RBI management may or may not accept the inputs of the board. But the board must have its say. This is elementary corporate governance. In accepting this principle, the November 19 meeting of the RBI board marks a big step forward.

Raiding the reserves?

Let us turn now to the decisions taken at the meeting. How much capital the RBI needs has been hotly contested in recent years. The government’s position is that the RBI’s reserves are in excess of reserves typically held by central banks elsewhere. Some commen-

tators have described the government’s position as an attempt to ‘raid the reserves’ of the RBI to fund its fiscal deficit. The suggestion seems to be that the RBI has cash which the government wants to steal for its own purposes.

This is a crude mis-characterisation of the position. The RBI’s reserves fall into two categories: revaluation reserves (which have mostly to do with the change in the rupee value of the RBI’s holdings of gold and foreign currencies) and contingent reserves (which represent plough back of a portion of the surplus earned by the RBI every year, the remaining portion being transferred to government as dividend).

Contingent reserves are intended for risks related to the RBI’s balance sheet. Let us suppose that these should not be touched. Revaluation reserves are an accounting entry. The RBI can reduce some of the revaluation reserves on the liability side and extinguish an equivalent value of government securities on the asset side. The latter step would lower the stock of debt owed by the government. This would provide headroom for the government to raise debt for meeting its future expenditure (including recapitalisation of public sector banks).

Retweeting brahminical patriarchy

It is either mischievous or ignorant to claim that ‘brahminical’ only refers to brahmins

Imagine a celebrity Indian CEO going to the United States and having himself photographed with women of colour while holding a poster that said, “Smash racist patriarchy”. And then, imagine white Americans coming down on him like a tonne of bricks, accusing him of inciting hatred and violence against white Americans. Sounds absurd? Good. Now imagine him actually apologising to the American public for wanting to end racist patriarchy. Sounds even more absurd? Well, this, or at least a version of this, has actually happened. Not in the la-la land of Donald Trump, but right here, in the world’s largest democracy.

The act and reaction

Recently, the Twitter CEO, Jack Dorsey, on a visit to India, had an informal discussion with a group of Indian women journalists, activists and writers about their experience on Twitter. In the course of the meeting, he was gifted a poster by one of the participants. It said,

‘Smash Brahminical Patriarchy’. When a group photograph of Mr. Dorsey posing with that poster surfaced on Twitter, it became an immediate target of outraged trolling. Both Mr. Dorsey and the organisation he heads were angrily accused of inciting hatred and violence against a “minority”, namely, brahmins.

The furious tweets spanned the whole gamut of indignation from A to B. Mr. Dorsey was accused of being a “brahmin-hating, racist bigot”. He was accused of propagating hatred towards “people who constitute 5% or less” of India’s population. Many compared the sentiment expressed in the poster to antisemitism, asking if he would dare pose in the U.S. with a placard advocating hatred of Jews. A serving civil servant even deemed it “a fit case for registration of a criminal case for attempt to destabilize (sic) the nation”. Mr. Dorsey’s apologetic critics wanted an immediate apology. And they got it, too.

While Twitter clarified that the content of the poster was “not a statement from Twitter or our CEO”, the company’s legal and policy head put out a tweet saying, “I’m very sorry for this. It’s not reflective (sic) of our views. We took a private photo with a gift just given to us – we should have been more

thoughtful. Twitter strives to be an impartial platform for all. We failed to do that here & we must do better to serve our customers in India.” This public apology was tweeted out in its wordy entirety not once, not twice, not three times, but eight times. The whole episode raises two simple questions: What was wrong with that poster? And what is wrong with Twitter?

Social order of caste

The first is disposed of easily enough: nothing. Someone patient enough to carefully poke through the mass of outrage piled up against Mr. Dorsey and his poster might discern the vague outlines of an argument, which essentially boils down to brahminical patriarchy coming to the defence of brahminical patriarchy.

First of all, it is a truth universal acknowledged (except in the pa-

So, yes, reducing reserves enables the government to spend – but not by stealing the RBI’s cash! It’s an idea that merits consideration. Whether reducing reserves from their current level via the accounting entries indicated above is appropriate for the RBI is for the proposed committee to judge.

Flow of bank credit

The other outcomes at the RBI board meeting have to do with increasing the flow of bank credit and easing the problems of borrowers, especially small and medium enterprises (SMEs).

Banks are subject to capital adequacy requirements – that is, they have to hold a minimum of capital against every rupee of loans they make. The RBI’s requirement of capital adequacy is one percentage point higher than that of the internationally accepted Basel norms laid down by the Bank for International Settlements. The government would like to align Indian banks’ requirements with the Basel norms as that would reduce the demands for capital made on it by public sector banks (PSBs).

The RBI did not yield on this point at the recent meeting. However, it has agreed to defer an increase in the capital requirement of banks of 0.625% under another head by one year. This does give the government some breathing space in respect of additional infusion of capital into PSBs.

The RBI has also agreed to consider the government’s suggestion for easing the norms for Prompt Corrective Action (PCA) for banks. The PCA imposes restrictions of various kinds on banks, including restrictions on lending for the weakest banks. The idea is that banks that are very weak should not create problems for themselves by making more loans. They

should focus on getting their balance sheet right by reducing costs, selling some of their non-core assets and the like.

This is fine in principle. However, if many banks face lending restrictions for a prolonged period, it could create serious problems for the economy. Large corporates could get into distress because of their linkages with distressed SMEs. So can the healthier banks that are exposed to these corporates. To use the jargon, a PCA regime has significant negative externalities. A relaxation in PCA norms, by translating into higher credit flows, could relieve stress in the broader economy. This also applies to the decision, approved at the meeting, to allow restructuring of SME assets of up to ₹25 crore.

The strident demand to enhance flows to non-banking financial companies (NBFCs), which was heard ahead of the meeting, finds no mention in the press note. It appears that the difficulties in rolling over NBFC debt that followed the collapse of Infrastructure Leasing and Financial Services (IL&FS), a leading NBFC, have abated somewhat. Evidently, the RBI was able to make a persuasive case on this point at the meeting.

It is the broader message of the November 19 meeting that is reassuring. As a public institution whose actions have enormous welfare implications, the RBI management cannot rule by fiat. Its actions must flow from a consultative process. It must explain and justify its actions. It must be seen to be accountable. The RBI board could be an important mechanism for ensuring that these conditions are met.

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community. By Brahmanism I mean the negation of the spirit of Liberty, Equality and Fraternity. In that sense it is rampant in all classes and is not confined to the Brahmins alone, though they have been the originators of it.”

The term (spelled as ‘brahmanism’ or ‘brahminism’), then, has been in currency for a long time as a descriptor of a social order marked by the graded inequality of caste. Therefore, this sudden eruption against it makes no sense except as a reactionary backlash against the steady mainstreaming of anti-caste politics on social media. Given that caste remains a powerful determinant of status and life chances in Indian society, such a backlash is perhaps not entirely surprising.

But what is, is the alacrity with which a powerful multinational firm, with pretensions to liberal values, chose to pander to feudal sentiment. It makes one wonder what, if anything, Mr. Dorsey and his organisation learned from their closed door interaction with Indian women journalists about their experiences on Twitter. Whatever it was, the need to support Indian women against caste oppression and patriarchy wasn’t a part of it.

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Getting justice for Asia Bibi

How Pakistan must win the battle of narratives to counter Islamist sectarians

Last month, the Pakistan Supreme Court acquitted Asia Bibi, a Christian woman accused of blasphemy, citing lack of evidence. The verdict must rank as the boldest in the chequered history of Pakistan. The judges showed remarkable courage in going against the far-right ideology responsible for the extralegal lynching of an estimated 60 persons accused of blasphemy since 1990.

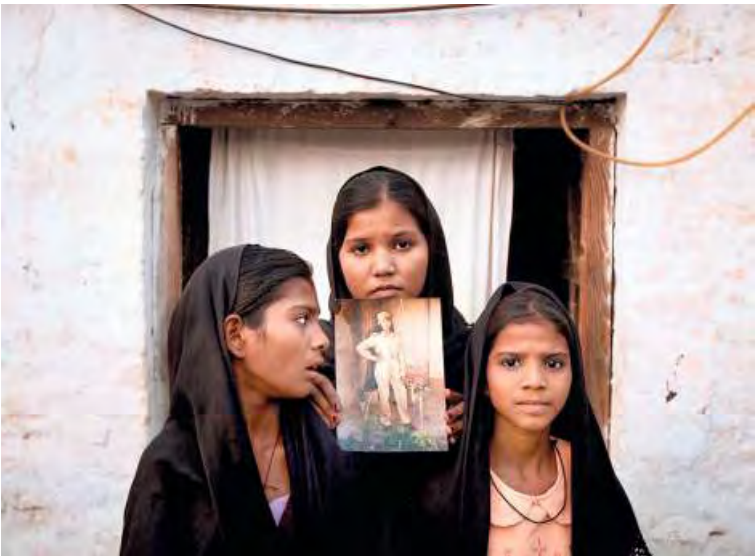
Indeed, in 1997, a judge of the Lahore High Court, Arif Iqbal Bhatti, who had dismissed a blasphemy case against two Christians, was killed. So were Salman Taseer, the outspoken Governor of Punjab, and Shahbaz Bhatti, Pakistan's Federal Minister for Minority Affairs, in January and March of 2011, respectively. Both of them were critical of the blasphemy laws and had defended Ms. Bibi.

Surrender of the Pakistani state

True to form, the Pakistani clerics' reaction to Ms. Bibi's acquittal was brutal. Thousands of their weapon-wielding henchmen blocked roads and burnt vehicles shouting "Hang Asia" slogans. Pir Muhammad Afzal Qadri, senior leader of the radical outfit Tehreek-e-Labbaik Pakistan (TLP), not only incited an insurrection against Pakistan Army Chief General Qamar Javed Bajwa, but also openly called for the assassination of the Supreme Court judges who discharged Ms. Bibi. If that was not horrific enough, he hurled an antisemitic slur at Prime Minister Imran Khan and sought the dismissal of his government. All this in the name of the Prophet whom the Quran calls *Rahmat al lil aalameen* (Mercy unto humanity)!

Such was the savageness of the clerical backlash that the government capitulated within two days of the verdict. This resulted in Pakistan's Religious Affairs Minister and the Law Minister of Punjab signing an agreement with the TLP. One of the two TLP signatories was Mr. Qadri.

Under the deal, the government agreed to take immediate steps to prevent Ms. Bibi from leaving the

country and promised not to contest the review petition filed against the verdict. Also, the arrested protesters would be released without delay and violence against them investigated. The only concession that could be extracted from the TLP was a deceitful *ma'azarat* (apology) to those who feel its activities had hurt them. The surrender of the Pakistani state could not have been more abject.

One fails to understand why Pakistan is constrained to pander to every whim of the extremists, especially when they do not enjoy popular support. The TLP, which has been consistently holding the state to ransom, did not win a single seat this year in the National Assembly despite fielding more than 170 candidates. The only inference that could be drawn from this is that an overwhelming majority of the Pakistani electorate does not subscribe to the medievalism of religious parties. Yet, the radicals can be seen dictating terms to even the powerful Pakistani military.

Some commentators attribute this to the belief that Pakistani citizens are not moderate. The argument is, if the extremists are not winning seats, it is because the mainstream parties have appropriated the discourse of the religious right on issues like blasphemy and women's rights. This reasoning is too simplistic. If, as alleged, the people of Pakistan had really been comfortable with radicalism, they would have backed authentic re-

ligious groups which hope to desecularise Pakistan. They would not have voted to power a mainstream party which only opportunistically resorts to the language of political Islam.

A conundrum explained

What explains this conundrum? The answer could lie in the Constitution which declared Pakistan to be an "Islamic Republic" perhaps without fully ascertaining if that was really "the will of the people of Pakistan" as the Preamble claims. The fact is, even Mohammad Ali Jinnah did not envision the state he was creating as a theodemocracy although he wanted Pakistan's Constitution to embody the "essential principles of Islam" such as equality, justice and fair play, which is totally different from making Islam the state religion.

In *Creating a New Medina*, Venkat Dhulipala points out that Jinnah considered Muslims in the "majority provinces" a nation only because they constituted a numerical majority in a contiguous piece of territory. On the other hand, he refused to accord the status of a "national group" to Muslims in the United Provinces because they were "scattered". In other words, there is no evidence to claim that Jinnah's definition of a nation was based on religion.

Yet, soon after his death, the Objectives Resolution (adopted in March 1949 and now part of the Pakistan Constitution) proclaimed inter

alia that "sovereignty over the entire universe belongs to Allah Almighty alone and the authority which He has delegated to the State of Pakistan, through its people for being exercised within the limits prescribed by Him is a sacred trust." Several provisions of the Constitution echo these views. Article 31, for instance, expects the state to take steps to enable Pakistani Muslims to live in accordance with the basic concepts of Islam and help them understand "the meaning of life according to the Holy Quran and Sunnah." From a Muslim point of view these assertions are justified. But the question is, on whose interpretation of the Quran and the Sunnah would "the limits" prescribed by Allah be determined and enforced? Who has authorised Pakistani theologians to hang a person for a crime she has not committed, especially when that crime does not carry the death penalty in Islam?

With fatwas of *kufr* (apostasy) and threats of assassination hanging over them like a sword of Damocles, the people and secular politicians of Pakistan cannot be expected to boldly speak out against the views of the rampaging clerics. Even the Supreme Court judges who acquitted Ms. Bibi thoughtfully began their ruling with the *Kalima-e-shahaadat* (the testimony of faith). But it was of no avail. The fatwa of apostasy was nevertheless issued against them.

The only way to reclaim Islam from the radicals is to dismantle their blinkered narrative by questioning the juristic devices of abrogation, sectarian consensus, exegetic rationales, and eisegesis. Through these instruments, Quranic verses and Prophetic *hadees* are either arrogantly repealed, semantically stifled, or gratuitously expanded to rationalise narrow sectarianism in the name of preserving the Shariah.

Simultaneously, a massive intellectual effort must be mounted to mainstream a concept of Quranic hermeneutics that is consistent with the core values of Islam: justice, fairness, equality, freedom of religion, moderation, kindness and mercy. The subjugation of the medievalists is almost entirely dependent on winning this battle of narratives.

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The post and the person

Safeguards are needed to ensure that institutions like the Election Commission are headed by capable people

The Constitution Bench of the Supreme Court is examining a public interest litigation (PIL) that could be critical for Indian democracy. The PIL, which seeks the strengthening of the Election Commission of India (ECI), includes a proposal to create an independent mechanism to appoint the Chief Election Commissioner (CEC) and Election Commissioners (ECs) who are, at present, simply appointed by the government of the day, without any defined criteria or processes.

Three critical decisions

That electoral democracy became a reality in India owes a great deal to the foresight of the Constituent Assembly. However, the Assembly could not have anticipated the extent to which the very political class that framed the Constitution would later attempt to subvert it. As this political dynamic unfolded, at certain crucial junctures, the judiciary and the leadership of the ECI saved democracy.

When the Constituent Assembly debated how free and fair elections should be ensured, three important questions arose. The first was whether free and fair elections should be made a part of fundamental rights or an independent institution, outside the executive, should be established to conduct the elections. The Assembly opted for the latter and created the ECI. With legal back up and the resources to develop and enforce a transparent electoral system, the ECI made free and fair elections a reality.

The second critical decision was to have a single, centralised body for elections to the Lok Sabha and State legislatures. One proposal was that the ECI be confined to federal elections, and separate institutions be set up to conduct elections to State legislatures. However, with increasing tension among communities, the Assembly feared partisan action in the States and opted for a single national institution, the ECI. The implications of this decision were complex. On the one hand, Central institutions have generally been more robust than State institutions. For example, State Election Commissions lack autonomy, are short on manpower and funds, and are frequently subject to attempts by State governments to manipulate elections. On the other, this decision could have led to an autocratic institution being established and possibly manipulated by powerful national actors. But this possibility was contained because elections became subject

to judicial review. Originally, the Constitution had provided for tribunals set up by the ECI to hear election petitions. But aggrieved parties approached the courts, and the courts decided to hear election petitions. Then the ECI itself recommended that election petitions be heard by the judiciary, and in 1966, the law was changed accordingly.

The third question concerned ensuring the independence of the ECI. As the manner of appointment of the CEC and ECs was debated, Shibban Lal Saxena presciently argued that while the then Prime Minister was a man of independence, this may not always be the case, and proposed ratification of the CEC's appointment by the legislature. But the Assembly disagreed, and provided simply for the CEC to be appointed by the President, leaving it to the legislature to enact a suitable law, which never happened. The Constituent Assembly did provide, though, that the CEC could only be removed through impeachment. For the ECs, even this safeguard was not provided, which is also a subject of the above-mentioned PIL.

A major shortcoming

The history of elections shows that this remains a major shortcoming of the ECI. From 1967 to 1991, the election process deteriorated as the Congress lost its dominance, political competition intensified, and political actors stepped up violence and electoral malpractices. The ECI could not arrest this deterioration. Several State governments made large-scale transfers on the eve of elections and posted pliable officials in key positions, who sometimes flouted the ECI's orders. This deterioration could have continued. Instead, during the 1996 general election, the ECI restored the credibility of the election process. The CEC, T.N. Seshan, reinterpreted the ECI's role and powers, and provided combative, forceful leadership. He publicly reprimanded politicians for violating the Model Code of Conduct, postponed/cancelled elections if their credibility was compromised, intensified supervision of elections, and insisted on action against errant officials. Because of constitutional safeguards, he could not be removed. But the ECI got the right leadership accidentally, not by design. Though the ECI has since become an institution of some authority, there have been controversies over appointments of ECs, allegations of partisanship, and new problems such as of voter bribery and paid news, which the ECI has not been able to address so far.

As history shows, inadequate leadership is the bane of our public institutions. Safeguards to ensure that ethical and capable people head them are crucial.

The notion of purity

The law alone cannot shatter a myth that has been built upon and aggrandised with every generation

The focus on female bodily functions has never been more critical or as intense than it is now. The Sabarimala judgment has sparked a clash between culture and nature, an amplification of a battle cry that began when women started questioning why they were barred from some places of worship. In 2016, a PIL was filed challenging the temple entry ban. That same year, women were allowed into Shani Shingnapur temple's sanctum sanctorum, in Maharashtra.

But equality will remain elusive as long as menstruation is considered taboo and linked to the idea of purity, or rather, the lack of it. Menstrual period is part of the female reproductive cycle when the body sheds the uterine lining if an egg is not fertilised. It is a rather mundane occurrence that is shrouded in a culture of shame.

In her essay, 'Is Female to Male as Nature is to Culture', American anthropologist Sherry B. Ortner argues that a woman's secondary status to man stems from the fact that the female physiology with its procreative functions is seen as closer to nature. The male body, on the other hand, is free from such restrictions. The dominant patriarchal view accords 'nature' far less value than 'culture' as the latter is associated with the creation of ideas and technology. For most women, menstruation can be uncomfortable and painful, and as Ms. Ortner points out, involves tasks of cleansing and waste disposal. "In many cultures it interrupts a woman's routine, putting her in a stigmatised state involving various restrictions on her activities and social contacts," she writes. So when Union Minister Smriti Irani questioned whether a woman would carry a "napkin seeped with menstrual blood into a friend's house," she was reinforcing ideas of purity that took root in society thousands of years ago. "Would you think it is respectful to do the same when you walk into the house of God? I have the right to pray, but no right to desecrate," she said at the time.

Most religions subscribe to this view. The *Book of Leviticus* in the Old Testament talks about purity and desecration in this context: "When a woman has a discharge consisting of blood from her body, for seven days she will be unclean due to menstruation, and anyone who touches her will be unclean until evening."

And when U.S. President Donald Trump said in 2015 that journalist Megyn Kelly had "blood coming out of her wherever" after she questioned his misogyny, he was reinforcing a stereotype that women everywhere are now challenging.

Desecration, impurity and defilement are powerful, negative words for a biological function that predates the evolution of culture. Increasingly, the legal system in India has been trying to address this imbalance, but the law alone cannot shatter a myth that has been built upon and aggrandised with every generation.

Limits of CBI jurisdiction

A provision that allows States to show their strength

Can States bar the Central Bureau of Investigation (CBI) from functioning in their territory?

Yes. The CBI is a national agency with police powers. Its primary jurisdiction is confined to Delhi and Union Territories. As policing (detecting crime and maintaining law and order) is a State subject, the law allows the agency to function outside only with the consent of the States. Andhra Pradesh and West Bengal have withdrawn their general consent to the CBI to operate within their territories.

Has it happened before?

And why?

There are several instances of State governments withdrawing their consent. There was even an instance in Sikkim, when the State withdrew its consent after the CBI registered a case

against former Chief Minister Nar Bahadur Bhandari, and before it could file a charge sheet. The most common reason for withdrawal of consent is a strain in Centre-State relations, and the oft-repeated allegation that the agency is being misused against Opposition parties. The decision by Andhra Pradesh and West Bengal has come amid concerns being voiced by Opposition parties that Central agencies such as the CBI, Enforcement Directorate and Income Tax Department are being used against them.

Under what law is it done?

The CBI draws its power from the Delhi Special Police Establishment (DSPE) Act. The Home Ministry, through a resolution, set up the agency in April 1963. Under Section 5 of the Act, the Central government can

extend its powers and jurisdiction to the States, for investigation of specified offences. However, this power is restricted by Section 6, which says its powers and jurisdiction cannot be extended to any State without the consent of the government of that State.

What is the impact of States taking back their consent?

The withdrawal of general consent restricts the CBI from instituting new cases in the State concerned. However, as decided by the Supreme Court in *Kazi Lhendup Dorji* (1994), the withdrawal of consent applies prospectively and therefore, existing cases will be allowed to reach their logical conclusion. The CBI can also seek or get specific consent in individual cases from the State government.

How has the consent

issue played out?

In most cases, States have given consent for a CBI probe against only Central government employees. The agency can also investigate a Member of Parliament. Apart from Mizoram, West Bengal and Andhra Pradesh, the agency has consent in one form or the other for carrying out investigations across the country.

What happens to cases in which there is a demand for a CBI probe?

The Supreme Court has made it clear that when it or a High Court directs that a particular investigation be handed over to the CBI, there is no need for any consent under the DSPE Act. A landmark judgment in this regard was the 2010 Supreme Court decision by which the killing of 11 Trinamool Congress workers in West Bengal in 2001 was handed over to the CBI.

World monetary crisis: 'Group of Ten' meet

West German Economics Minister Karl Schiller said to-day [November 21, Bonn] that financial leaders of the 10 major non-Communist industrial countries were facing very difficult problems in their efforts to solve the current international monetary crisis. He told reporters after a three-hour session on the second day of the conference of Ministers and Central Bank Governors of the 'Group of Ten' that a lot of time would still be required to work out solutions. More than 100 delegates of the group began an emergency conference yesterday in a bid to end recent massive speculation against the French franc. The Group of Ten are the United States, Canada, Britain, France, West Germany, Belgium, the Netherlands, Italy, Sweden and Japan.

A HUNDRED YEARS AGO NOVEMBER 22, 1918.

Post-War Trade Policy.

The Committee of the Bengal Chamber of Commerce has issued a report on the future trade policy of India concerning tariffs. After considering the opinion expressed by individual firms the Committee came to the following decision. The policy to be followed in this connection should be, the special Sub-Committee think, based on the principle of reciprocity with preference within the British Empire. In other words the treatment of imports into and exports from the British Empire should be made to depend mainly on the treatment accorded by foreign nations to exports to and imports from British possessions. If a country is willing to extend to British Empire the advantages of free trade then the Empire should be willing to trade with that country on the same terms. On the other hand, tariffs should be imposed as against those countries into heavy import duties on the British Empire.

J&K Governor dissolves Assembly

The Governor, while issuing the order to dissolve the Assembly, pointed to the impossibility of a stable government being formed by political parties with opposing political ideologies.

The experience of the past few years showed that with the fractured mandate, it was not possible to form a stable government.

“The coming together of such parties in a grouping is nothing but an attempt to gain power rather than to form a responsive government,” said Mr. Malik.

He said there were also reports of extensive horse trading and possible exchange of money, in order to secure the support of legislators belonging to widely diverging political ideologies just to form a government.

“Such activities are not healthy for democracy and vitiate the political process,”

the Governor added.

National Conference leader and former Chief Minister Omar Abdullah cried foul over the Governor’s decision.

“The NC has been pressing for Assembly dissolution for five months now. It can’t be a coincidence that within minutes of Mehbooba Mufti Sahiba’s letter staking claim the order to dissolve the Assembly suddenly appears,” said Mr. Abdullah.

Senior PDP leader Naqem Akhtar said the BJP-backed PC claim only hinted at the “illegitimate means the two parties were planning to employ in J&K to cobble together the required numbers.”

Earlier, in an eventful day, arch rivals, the NC and the PDP, decided to join hands to form a unity government, with the Congress openly offering its support.

Birds flee devastated Point Calimere

Great flamingo, Painted Stork, Little Stint, Seagull and Brown-headed gull are normally found in the sanctuary. Punjab Chief Minister Capt. Amarinder Singh said on Wednesday that the accused in Sunday’s attack on a religious congregation near Amritsar were associated with the banned outfit, Khalistan Liberation Force (KLF).

Security agencies say the KLF, an extremist organisation active in the 1980s, was revived in 2009 in Malaysia under pressure from Pakistan’s Inter Services Intelligence (ISI).

It is currently being headed by Harmeet Singh, alias “PhD”, of Amritsar who is working under the “tutelage of Pakistan’s ISI”.

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) says Harmeet Singh has been living at Gurdwara Bibi Nanki in

Lahore since 2008. He used Skype to radicalise an Italy-based Sikh youth, Hardeep Singh, and convinced him to come to India to carry out specific attacks.

He would fly down from Italy every time he was assigned a target.

The NIA chronicled the revival of the extremist outfit in May when the agency accused KLF of being involved in eight incidents of murder and attempted murders of RSS leaders and a pastor in Punjab in 2016 and 2017. Singh and a sewing machine mechanic, Raman-deep, were accused by NIA to be involved in all the killings.

Founded by Aroor Singh The NIA said the main objective of the KLF is to “liberate the so-called Khalistan”.

Modi govt. trying to weaken democracy, says Manmohan

‘Credibility of institutions like Parliament and CBI systematically denigrated’

The Narendra Modi government is trying to weaken democracy, his predecessor, Manmohan Singh, said in Indore on Wednesday.

Ahead of the Assembly elections in Madhya Pradesh and other States, the former Prime Minister addressed a press conference, his first.

“The country has witnessed the credibility of institutions like Parliament and CBI being systematically denigrated. There is a careful, well-thought-out and calibrated effort to weaken democracy,” he said, reading out from a written statement.

“The rule of law is under attack. History shall never forgive our present generation if the situation is not changed,” Dr. Singh said.

Answering questions later, he criticised the Prime Minister’s conduct. “It does not befit the PM to abuse political opponents,” he said,

accusing him of using “un-parliamentary words” against the Opposition.

Asked about his 2014 comments that Narendra Modi as PM would be a disaster to the country, he said he did not want to comment on his earlier remarks.

“I used harsh words which I should not have. Now people will make the decision,” he added.

In a veiled reference to developments in the RBI and the CBI, Dr. Singh said the Modi government was trying

to prevail over big institutions, and this would be detrimental to democracy and the law of the land.

“The relationship between the RBI and the Finance Ministry has hit a low,” the former Union Finance Minister and Reserve Bank Governor said, adding there is a need for “harmony and coordination”.

“The RBI Governor and the Finance Minister have a delicate relationship. Both have to work together. Even though the job of running

the country rests with the government, specific responsibility is given to the RBI Governor by the RBI Act. There is a need to recognise interdependence of the two entities and work in harmony,” he said.

“I am happy with the efforts being made to bring reconciliation. Both need to work in harmony with each other,” he said.

“The maximum number of people in India, who ended their life due to unemployment, belong to BJP-ruled Madhya Pradesh,” he said.

He criticised the State government led by Shivraj Singh Chouhan for failing to provide employment opportunities to youth. He cited an instance in February this year when 2,81,000 persons, some holding Ph.D.s, applied for 738 posts of peon.

Dr. Singh also attacked the Shivraj Singh Chouhan government on various alleged scams such as Vyapam.

BJP targets Kamal Nath after 1984 riots verdict

Congress needs to answer questions over its sincerity in prosecuting cases, says Ravi Shankar Prasad

The BJP on Wednesday turned the spotlight on Madhya Pradesh Congress chief Kamal Nath, a day after a Delhi court sentenced two people for their roles in the 1984 anti-Sikh riots.

The party demanded that the Congress answer charges that it had scuttled earlier commissions of inquiry into the riots to protect some of its leaders.

Claiming that the Congress had removed Mr. Nath as the party’s Punjab election in-charge after protests over his alleged role in the riots, Union Law Minister Ravi Shankar Prasad said at a press conference here that the Congress needed to answer questions over its sincerity in prosecuting cases related to the 1984 riots.

Mr. Nath has said he had no links with the riots which erupted in the wake of the

assassination of the then Prime Minister, Indira Gandhi, by her Sikh bodyguards.

‘An eyewash’

Contending that the Congress had, during its rule, “tried to ensure that the Sikh riot victims did not get justice,” he said several commissions of inquiry set up by Congress-led governments were “either an eyewash or were wound up when they

seemed to be getting somewhere”. Mr. Prasad alleged that “the Opposition party did this to save its own people.”

He also credited the probe by the Special Investigation Team (SIT), set up in 2015 by the government headed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, for facilitating the conviction of the two people this month, almost 35 years after the riots. While the court

Setback for Vijay Mallya in foreclosure case

Swiss bank UBS’s attempt to foreclose on a mortgage loan on a London property of Vijay Mallya’s gained ground as the judge in the case approved its application to strike out certain parts of an amended defence submitted in May by the businessman’s legal team, on almost all counts.

The case at the business and property courts of the Royal Court of Justice has been ongoing as the bank has sought to take possession of the property in prime central London, over the £20.4 million interest.

The bank says that Rose Capital, through which the house was originally purchased in 2005, had not repaid the loan, that was stated to be for a period of five years and subject to early termination by the claimant.

Mr. Mallya’s legal team have sought to fight the application from UBS on a number of grounds, including a failure to recognise occupation rights and an alle-

BJP seeks action on leaked video

Says Cong. leader violated poll code

A delegation of the BJP met with officials of the Election Commission of India demanding action against the Congress over a leaked video of Madhya Pradesh Congress Committee chief Kamal Nath, accusing him of violating the code of conduct and invoking religious sentiments and appealing to a particular religious community.

The delegation was led by Union Minister Mukhtar Abbas Naqvi along with members of Parliament Mee-nakshi Lekhi and Anil Baluni.

It cited news reports of an opinion poll broadcast by India News Channel and conducted by C-For agency on November 18, stating that this violated the model code of conduct.

They also cited tweets by Mr. Nath promising regularisation of Aanganwadi workers in Madhya Pradesh if elected, and of raising allowances of midday meal

workers when no such announcement was made in the Congress’s manifesto and was therefore in violation of Section 123 of the Representation of the People Act read along with Sections 171B and 171C of the Indian Penal Code.

Significantly, it also cited a leaked video of Mr. Nath allegedly addressing a gathering which exclusively to Muslim voters to mobilise 90% polling in favour of the Congress on Muslim dominated polling booths.

“This is against the spirit of free and fair polls,” the delegation said in its letter submitted to the commission.

sentenced one convict to death, it awarded a life term to the other.

“We [BJP] are very satisfied,” Mr. Prasad said. “The Nanavati Commission set up by the Atal Bihari Vajpayee government had found evidence of systematic killing of Sikhs in 1984. But between 2005 and 2014, the UPA government did not take any authentic steps to provide justice to victims. The Modi government took steps that gave justice to victims of the 1984 killings,” he said.

Promise to Sikhs

The Law Minister said his party wanted to assure Sikhs, especially those whose families had suffered, that the SIT would probe the cases honestly, without any undue outside interference, and take action against the guilty.

Mr. Prasad said Rajiv Gandhi, who succeeded his

mother Indira Gandhi as Prime Minister, had said that the earth shook when a big tree fell, and alleged that the Congress had condoned the organised violence against Sikhs.

“No one in the Congress has denied that remark till date,” he said.

The BJP’s NDA ally, the Akali Dal, went a step further with the former Punjab Deputy Chief Minister Sukhbir Singh Badal demanding that Congress leader Sonia Gandhi be summoned by the SIT for questioning.

To a query about other riots, including those in Gujarat in 2002, Mr. Prasad said there had been convictions in many of the Gujarat riots cases, and added that a Supreme Court-monitored SIT had questioned Mr. Modi, who was the State’s Chief Minister at the time, for three days and subsequently given him a clean chit.

said that striking out a claim was a step that the court would “not take lightly,” and only took place if a claim was “bound to fail.”

NIA files chargesheet against DeM chief

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) has in a chargesheet filed last week, reproduced interviews given to a prominent Kashmiri newspaper as prime evidence against Dukhtar-e-Millat (DeM) chief Asiya Andrabi and her two associates.

In the chargesheet against Ms. Andrabi and two others, Sofi Fehmeeda and Nahida Nasreen, the NIA said DeM, a separatist outfit based in the Kashmir Valley, was collecting gold jewellery through donations and raised funds by selling them. The accused were arrested on July 5 and are now in Tihar jail.

The NIA said it could not

attach the photograph of the accused in the chargesheet as they were *pardanash-een* (veiled). Ms. Andrabi supported Lashkar-e-Jabbar (LeJ), a terrorist outfit that threw acid on two women in Srinagar in 2000 for not adhering to the Islamic dress code, the agency said.

It said Ms. Andrabi asked women to stay away from government jobs, and investigations revealed that the DeM does not accept as members any women who work for financial institutions such as banks and who are married to soldiers or police personnel. The chargesheet accessed by *The Hindu* said the DeM worked closely with multiple terrorist outfits and Kashmiri separatist leaders.

Upper caste angst may queer pitch for BJP

Younger voters, concerned about the lack of jobs, seem to be lending some wind to the Congress's sails this time around

Vijay Kumar Dubey, a traditional BJP supporter, predicts a close contest in the Madhya Pradesh Assembly election.

The middle-aged Brahmin trader, who runs a shop near the bustling Bada area in Gwalior, has his reasons for the assessment.

“The Goods and Services Tax has cut into businessmen’s profits,” he says, with an air of bitterness. “Why is it that only traders are referred to when we talk about black money? Why are there no raids on rich politicians?”

And he has another grievance: “The Chief Minister said that no *mai ka laal* can take away reservations. Okay, but why this kind of tone? Who will talk about the *Savarnas* [upper castes]?”

For the first time in an election in the State, caste and reservations have become a common refrain. Madhya Pradesh, unlike Ut-

tar Pradesh or Bihar, hitherto did not have nuanced caste-based issues casting a shadow over electoral outcomes.

Residents say the polarisation over the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act was the tipping point, with an undercurrent of upper caste concerns becoming

distinctly discernible in political discussions in recent months.

Conversations with upper caste voters in urban areas reveal a broad pattern: while most expect the BJP will retain power, they predict – without revealing their voting intentions – a *kaante ki takkar* (a close fight) between the Congress and the

BJP. There are also those who are openly critical of the BJP and wish to see change, flagging a likely splintering of votes from upper castes – a bloc that had largely been pro-BJP.

The upper castes – the Brahmins, Thakurs, Baniyas and Kayasths – constitute about 17% of the population of the State, show data cited

by Christophe Jaffrelot in his book *Rise of the Plebeians*. They are more numerous in the Malwa, Bundelkhand and Baghelkhand regions than in the Mahakoshal region.

Sapaks, a spoiler?

While the Sapaks party is trying to capitalise on this undercurrent of *Savarna* unease, the BJP still remains the party that most upper caste voters trust, their discontent over the restoration of the SC/ST Act notwithstanding.

At the Dewas Gate area in Ujjain, a conversation with three elderly men, all Thakurs, shows their sympathies are still with the BJP. The Sapaks, they say, will cut into some of the upper caste votes, particularly among “short-sighted and misguided” voters.

However, it is the younger voters among the upper castes, who seem to be lending some wind to the Congress’s sails this time around.

“One good thing about Rajasthan is that it keeps shifting from one party to the other every five years,” says Ashish Tiwari, a Gwalior-based student who is a Brahmin. “Change is not bad sometimes. If you use the same umbrella for 15 years, it will begin to leak. You need to change it.”

Even in Budhni, Shivraj Singh Chouhan’s constituency, jobs are a matter of concern for upper caste youth, though they agree that Mr. Chouhan will be hard to beat being the sitting Chief Minister. Rahul Rajput, a Thakur from Budhni who is in his mid-20s, says he has no job despite having a Master’s degree and a diploma in computer application. The town’s two textile mills do not employ local youth, he says.

“The Chief Minister has made too many promises, but his strike rate in terms of implementation is not good,” he says.

VVPATs do well in Chhattisgarh

Expert training helped, says official

The two phases of the Assembly election in Chhattisgarh recorded low failure of electronic voting machines (EVMs) and voter verifiable paper audit trail (VVPAT) units compared with their performance in recent polls.

During polling, only 0.34% of the ballot units, 0.39% of the control units and 1.89% of the VVPATs had to be replaced. The figures for the mock polls stood at 0.72%, 0.88% and 1.68%.

“Comprehensive training of polling personnel resulted in better handling of the machines,” an official said.

In reserve

The poll panel used 23,677 control units, 30,696 ballot units and 23,677 VVPATs for the election. It had kept more than 3,900 VVPATs, 2,852 control units and 3,659 ballot units in reserve. In the Karnataka Assem-

ly election on May 12, nearly 1,700 VVPATs developed glitches during the mock test, amounting to nearly 4.2% of all the machines.

This figure was encouraging compared with the high rate of malfunction during the Lok Sabha byelections in Kairana (Uttar Pradesh) and Palghar and Bhandra-Gondiya in Maharashtra, the official said. The VVPAT replacement rate was as high as 20.82% in Kairana, 19.22% in Bhandara-Gondia and 13.16% in Palghar.

Following the glitches detected during the Lok Sabha bypolls, the poll panel got an analysis done by its technical experts committee, which found that excessive exposure to light was a prominent cause.

The machine’s deplete sensor would malfunction due to the EC logo on printing paper.

TRS, TDP face off in high-octane contest

Ruling party banks on ‘development plank’ to sway voters

A high-octane battle is on the cards in the Khammam constituency with the TDP, in alliance with the Congress, the CPI and the Telangana Jana Samiti, banking on the combined strength to win the high-profile seat in the December 7 election.

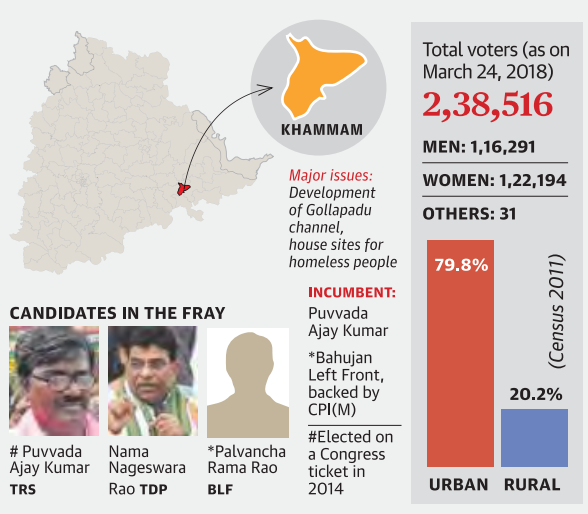
The ruling TRS is pinning its hopes on the “development plank” to retain its sway in the constituency where it has fielded former MLA Puvvada Ajay Kumar.

By fielding a backward classes leader, Palvantha Rama Rao, from the constituency, the CPI(M)-backed Bahujan Left Front (BLF) is hoping to spring a surprise by relying on the support of weaker sections, which constitute the lion’s share of the electorate.

The BJP is also trying to make inroads into the constituency.

The candidates of the main political parties have focussed their attention on winning the support of Muslim minorities, traders and employees who form a sizeable chunk of the total electorate.

The TDP campaign managers have drawn up plans to organise roadshows by party president N. Chandrababu Naidu and the actor-turned politician N. Balakrishna in the final leg of the campaign, TDP sources said.

Chief Minister K. Chandrababunaidu and Deputy Chief Minister Mahamood Ali have already campaigned for the TRS candidate.

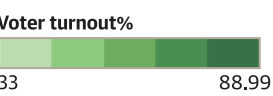
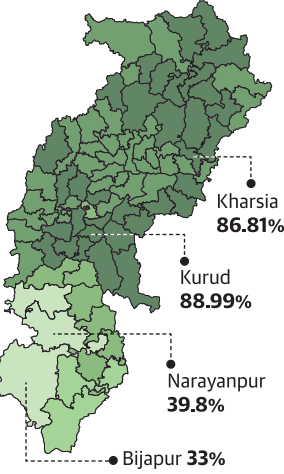

JVP and TNA must fight together

Leftist party leader says both can find common ground, and protect democratic rights together

Sri Lanka's leftist Janatha Vimukthi Peramuna (JVP) and the Tamil National Alliance (TNA) have a duty to fight together and protect democratic rights, JVP leader Anura Dissanayake said, proposing a novel partnership between parties representing the country's two main ethnic groups.

"The JVP (or People's Liberation Front) and the TNA represent sections in the country's south and north that have suffered most due to the actions of the repressive state," he said in an interview to *The Hindu* on Wednesday.

He was referring to the JVP's two youth insurrections in 1971 and 1987-89 that were suppressed by state violence, and the Tamil armed struggle that was militarily defeated in 2009.

Mr. Dissanayake's comments come in light of a month-long political crisis in Sri Lanka, which began with President Maithripala Sirisena's arbitrary sacking of Prime Minister Ranil Wickremesinghe, and the appointment of former President Mahinda Rajapaksa in his place. The Sirisena-Rajapaksa combine has since disrupted Parliament and rejected two confidence votes passed in the House, without proving a majority.

Ideological shifts

As a political party, the JVP has undergone major shifts in the five decades since its founding. In more recent years, it saw two groups breaking away and forming new parties. The leadership of Mr. Dissanayake, 49, in the last few years is seen as giving the party some renewed vigour and visibility.

All the same, suggesting that the party's links to its past and core ideology may still be intact in some measure, the reception of the party headquarters has a photograph of its rebel leader Rohana Wijeweera, sport-

ing a "Che cap", a thick beard and a wide smile. In the visitors' room, three large black and white photographs – of Marx, Engels and Lenin – occupy a prominent place on the wall.

Ahead of the 2015 presidential election, the JVP was at the forefront of opposition to Mr. Rajapaksa. Last week, again, the JVP, with its six MPs, and the TNA that has 14 MPs, proved to be a formidable force in the 225-member Parliament, taking on Mr. Rajapaksa.

In addition to their resistance to Mr. Rajapaksa's "power grab" facilitated by President Sirisena's "illegal and unconstitutional moves", they voted against Mr. Rajapaksa, indirectly helping ousted PM Wickre-

mesinghe's front muster a critical majority.

Apart from working with the TNA on key manoeuvres in the House, Mr. Dissanayake sees potential for long-term collaboration. "Even though we may have some differences on certain issues, we will be able to work together closely in the future, on most questions."

Since neither party had a "secret agenda" and both worked based on "principles and policies", it was possible to work together in a transparent way.

Observing that people in the north and east have been suffering the most since the end of the war, Mr. Dissanayake said: "Now we need a united struggle by the people of the south and north...

we work with them on the basis of democracy and equality. We are working for social transformation in this country and the Northern Province must also be part of that transformation. We have a common cause and we are committed to working together with all communities."

Common interests

In Mr. Dissanayake's view, neither Mr. Rajapaksa nor Mr. Wickremesinghe worked with the TNA "with integrity". "They exploited the TNA and its engagement for their own interests."

Pointing to more things "in common" between the SLFP and the UNP, Mr. Dissanayake noted that their "core economic policy" was the same.

"That is why a former General Secretary of the SLFP [Sirisena] could become the Presidential candidate in a UNP-led alliance, that is why Ministers and MPs are able to switch camps so easily on a daily basis. There is no difference in the fundamental economic project of these two parties."

And that is also why the JVP cannot directly back UNP or Mr. Wickremesinghe, even in the current crisis, he said. .

No claim yet as Kabul blast toll rises to 55

Taliban denies responsibility for attack

Afghan authorities were struggling on Wednesday to identify the group behind a suicide bomb attack that killed at least 55 people at a gathering of religious scholars in Kabul after the Taliban denied any responsibility.

The victims included religious delegates from various parts of the country, invited by the Afghan Ulema Council to celebrate the birth anniversary of Prophet Muhammed on Tuesday.

Motive unclear

Without knowing who was behind the attack, it was unclear whether the aim was to undermine President Ashraf Ghani's government, or whether it was part of a strategy to keep the pressure on his government and its Western allies while they pursued talks with the Taliban, to end the 17-year long war.

"As of now, we don't know which militant outfit could be behind the attack. Investigations are at a preliminary stage," said a senior security official.

The council, the country's largest religious organisation, gathered scholars from the Sunni sect, but it was uncertain whether the attack could have had a sectarian dimension.

Though Sunni themselves, Taliban and Islamic State fighters have targeted religious scholars aligned with the Afghan government in the past.

This time, the Taliban quickly denied responsibility and condemned the attack on religious preachers and scholars, but investigators in Kabul said the hard-line Islamist group's involve-

ment cannot be ruled out. The toll from Tuesday's attack could rise as most of the 80 wounded had severe injuries, hospital and government officials said.

On Wednesday, two rockets hit Ghazni city where the top U.S. general leading the NATO-led force in Afghanistan, Scott Miller, was meeting the provincial Governor and senior officials at the Governor's compound, said Ahmad Khan Serat, a spokesman for Ghazni police.

"Gen. Miller was not hurt in the rocket attack," Serat said, adding that two rockets fell on a money exchange market, about 200 m from the Governor's compound in the central strategic province.

Debra Richardson, a spokesperson for the NATO-led Resolute Support mission, said Mr. Miller was in Ghazni province for a meeting with Afghan military leadership to discuss security.

"While he was there, the Taliban indiscriminately launched indirect fire but we do not believe General Miller was the target," Mr. Richardson said in a statement.

South Korean candidate chosen as Interpol chief

International police organisation Interpol on Wednesday elected Kim Jong-yeon of South Korea as president, beating a Russian whose candidacy had raised concerns in Europe and the United States about the risk of Kremlin interference.

Interpol's Secretary-General Jurgen Stock told repor-

ters Mr. Kim's election was free and transparent after Russia said clear outside pressure had been exerted on the vote.

Mr. Kim was elected president, a largely ceremonial role, at Interpol's annual congress in Dubai for a two-year term to succeed China's Meng Hongwei.

The presidency is typically held for four years. "The

general assembly elected Mr. Kim from Korea as president through a voting process which was democratic, transparent, free and clear," said Mr. Stock of Germany who heads day-to-day work at Interpol.

The president is elected after winning a two-thirds majority among members in a secret ballot, according to Interpol's website.

U.S. and European politicians and Kremlin critics had lobbied against the candidacy of Alexander Prokopchuk of Russia, a police major-general and one of Interpol's four vice-presidents.

"No matter... what the nationality of the presidency is, it is not affecting Interpol's neutrality and the independence of our organisation," said Mr. Stock. Interpol's

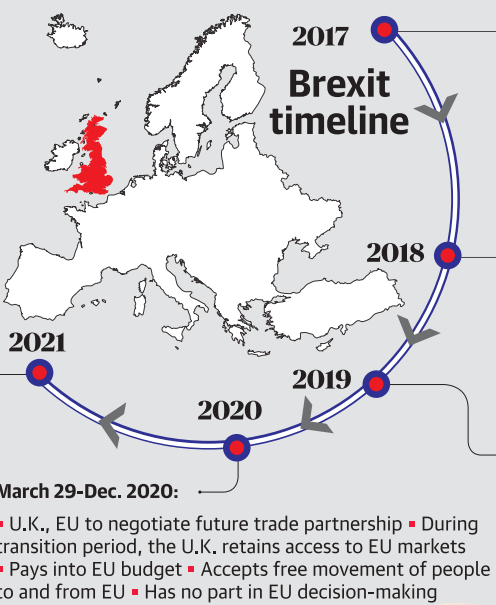
role is to facilitate cooperation between police forces around the world. Its charter forbids it from involving itself in disputes of a political, religious or racial nature.

Kremlin spokesman Dmitry Peskov told reporters: "We regret that it wasn't our candidate, but nonetheless there are no grounds to disagree with the election result."

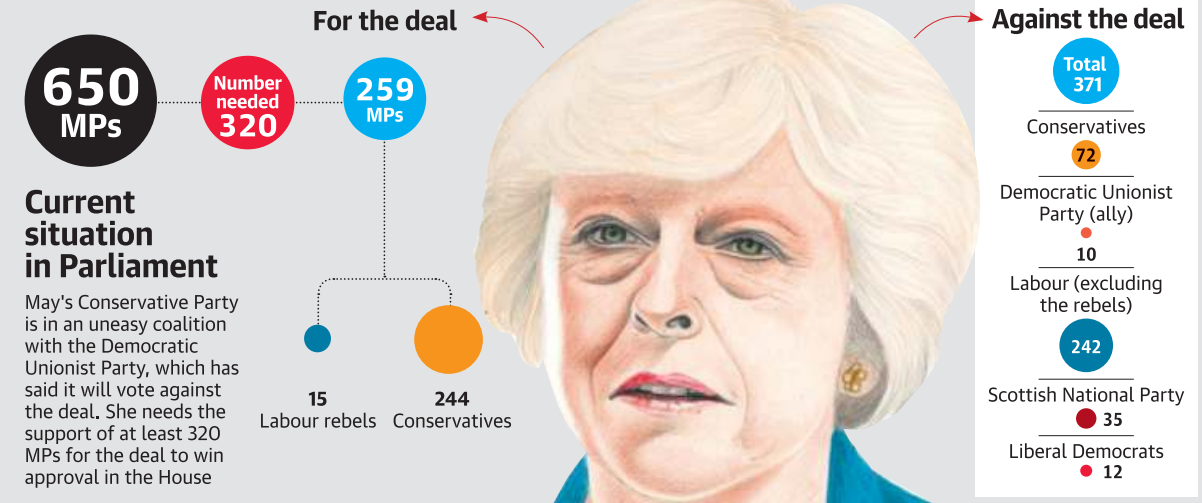

WTO panels to review U.S. steel, aluminium tariffs

This comes after failure of talks

The World Trade Organization agreed on Wednesday to hear complaints from a range of countries over new U.S. steel and aluminium tariffs, as well as complaints from Washington over retaliatory duties.

The WTO's Dispute Settlement Body (DSB) agreed to establish panels to review U.S. President Donald Trump's decision to hit a long line of countries with tariffs of 25% on steel and 10% on aluminium.

The DSB will create separate panels for the complaints by the European Un-

ion (EU), China, Canada, Mexico, Norway and Russia, after the U.S. said it would not agree to a single panel to hear all of them.

The DSB agreed on Wednesday to Washington's request for three panels to rule on the legality of retaliatory tariffs imposed by Canada, China and the EU.

It also agreed to a U.S. call for a panel to be created to review "certain Chinese measures pertaining to the protection of intellectual property rights."

The decision to establish the panels follows rounds of failed consultations between the parties.

'Hunger may have killed 84,700 Yemen children'

Estimate based on UN data, says group

An estimated 85,000 children under five may have died from extreme hunger in Yemen since a Saudi-led coalition intervened in the civil war in 2015, a humanitarian body said on Wednesday, as the UN special envoy arrived in Yemen to pursue peace talks.

Western countries are pressing for a ceasefire and renewed peace efforts to end the disastrous conflict, which has unleashed the world's most urgent humanitarian crisis with 8.4 million people believed to be on the verge of starvation.

Save the Children said that according to a conservative estimate based on United Nations data, approximately 84,700 children suffering from severe acute malnutrition may have died between April 2015 and October 2018 in the impoverished country, where a Western-backed Arab alliance is battling the Iranian-aligned Houthis who holds the capital Sana'a.

The last available figure from the United Nations for the death toll from the conflict, seen as a proxy war between Saudi Arabia and Iran, was in 2016 and stood at more than 10,000.

'Great that oil prices are falling. Thank you to Saudi Arabia, but let's go lower'

President Donald Trump on Wednesday publicly thanked Saudi Arabia for plunging oil prices amid criticism over his decision not to further punish the kingdom for the killing of U.S.-based columnist Jamal Khashoggi.

Mr. Trump, who made clear in an exclamation-filled statement on Tuesday that he feels that the benefits of good relations with the kingdom outweigh the possibility that its Crown Prince ordered the killing, tweeted that it's "Great!" that oil prices are falling.

"Thank you to Saudi Arabia, but let's go lower!" he wrote from his Mar-a-Lago club in Palm Beach, Florida, where he's spending the Thanksgiving holiday.

UAE sentences British academic to life in prison on spying charges

U.K. warns that the verdict will impact bilateral ties

A UAE court sentenced British academic Matthew Hedges to life in prison on charges of spying for the British government on Wednesday, his family and a state-run newspaper said, in a move described as deeply disappointing by Prime Minister Theresa May.

The hearing lasted less than five minutes and his lawyer was not present, his family said. "We are of course deeply disappointed and concerned at today's verdict," Ms. May told Parliament.

She and Foreign Minister Jeremy Hunt said they were raising the case at the highest levels of the UAE government.

'Not expected'

"Today's verdict is not what we expect from a friend and trusted partner of the United Kingdom and runs contrary

to earlier assurances," said Mr. Hunt. He said the handling of the case by Emirati authorities would have repercussions on relations between the old allies and urged them to reconsider their decision.

Mr. Hedges, a 31-year-old doctoral student at Durham University, has been held in the UAE since May 5, when he was arrested at Dubai International Airport after a two-week research visit.

The evidence presented against him consisted of

notes from his dissertation research, his family said.

The hearing was closed to the public. A court statement was carried by state-run newspaper *The National*. A life sentence for a non-Emirati entails a maximum of 25 years in jail and is followed by deportation, according to the paper.

The court ruled that his devices and research would be confiscated, the newspaper reported, adding that Mr. Hedges could appeal the ruling within 30 days.

Mr. Hedges was made to sign a confession statement in Arabic that he did not understand and experienced deterioration in both his physical and mental health during his detention, his family said. *The National* reported that he was arrested after an Emirati man told police he had been asking for sensitive information and confessed to the charges during questioning.

We are interested in having a warehouse in India: LME CEO

'Fantastic that India is experimenting with commodities traded nowhere else'

India is an important market for the London Metal Exchange (LME), as Indian bourses are dependent on the global exchange for commodity prices. CEO Matthew Chamberlain, however, is interested in increasing LME's presence in the country by establishing a warehouse as India and China are the only two major economies in the world without an LME warehouse. Excerpts from an interview:

LME has warehouses across the globe. But, you still do not have a presence in two major markets - India and China. I think in India it is really about the logistics. Certainly, LME is interested and we need to make sure our Indian partners are interested as well. We don't want to do it if it is not what the Indian market wants. Since it is about logistics, LME warehouses are generally in Free Trade Zones where they are set up with a particular tax treatment. We will have to look at how that would work but yes, we have warehouses all around the world; There is no reason why it couldn't happen in India as well. It is often said that commodity markets are more about speculation as there is hardly any physical delivery. Even on the LME, fewer than 1% of contracts go to delivery and that's the case for most global commodities fu-

U.S. court ruling a boost for Dr. Reddy's

Scrip gains 5.9% after appeals court permits pharma firm to sell generic version of Indivior's Suboxone

Dr. Reddy's Laboratories' shares gained nearly 6% on Wednesday in the wake of a U.S. court decision permitting it to sell a generic version of British drugmaker Indivior's opioid dependence treatment drug Suboxone. The decision of the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit (CAFC) vacates the District Court's preliminary injunction that prohibited Dr. Reddy's from selling the generic version of Suboxone (buprenorphine and naloxone) sublingual film.

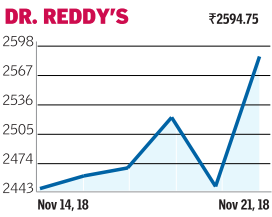
A statement from the Hyderabad-headquartered firm said the appeals court decision concluded that Indivior had not shown that it is likely to succeed on the merits of its infringement case on US Patent No. 9,931,305. Following the development, Dr. Reddy's said it

would resume the launch activities for the generic drug as soon as permitted. "We are pleased with the decision of the appellate court vacating the preliminary injunction that had prevented Dr. Reddy's from bringing this important drug to the public," a company spokesperson said. Dr. Reddy's scrip, which had closed on Tuesday at

₹2450.25 apiece, opened at ₹2,605 on Wednesday to quickly touch ₹2,651.50, or 8.21%. It ended the day at ₹2,594.75 each, an increase of 5.90%. The U.S. Food and Drug Administration (USFDA), had in June, approved Dr. Reddy's Buprenorphine and Naloxone Sublingual Film, in four strengths, for sale in the U.S. market. The product



was launched immediately after approval, but sales and commercialisation activities were halted as a result of a court-imposed temporary restraining order (TRO) against Dr. Reddy's. The TRO did not include a prohibition on commercial manufacturing of the product, the company said. A statement from Indivior said in the absence of a preliminary injunction, the company assumed DRL would resume launch of its generic buprenorphine/naloxone sublingual film product in the U.S. Following the ruling vacating the preliminary in-

junction, Dr. Reddy's had filed a motion requesting the appeals court to either issue the mandate immediately or alternatively stay the injunction pending issuance of the mandate.

'Will pursue cases' Indivior CEO Shaun Thaxter said: "We will continue to vigorously pursue our infringement cases against DRL to protect our Suboxone film patent portfolio, including filing a petition with the CAFC for both panel rehearing and rehearing en banc of the ruling vacating the preliminary injunction, as well as opposing DRL's motion to immediately issue a mandate or stay the current PI until the mandate is issued." In the event of the generic version entering the market in 2018, the result would most likely be a rapid and material loss of market share for Suboxone, Indivior said.

₹29,088-cr. indirect tax evasion detected

Service tax dodgers formed the bulk

The investigation arm of the Finance Ministry has detected tax evasion worth ₹29,088 crore in 1,835 cases in the April-October period of the current financial year, a senior official said Wednesday.

571 cases in GST Of this, the Directorate General of GST Intelligence (DGGI), which is enforcement agency for checking indirect tax evasion, has detected evasion of goods and services tax (GST) worth ₹4,562 crore in 571 cases. However, the bulk of the evasion was detected in case of service tax. The total number of cases where service tax was evaded stood at 1,145 involving ₹22,973 crore. In case of central excise duty, the DGGI detected

119 cases, where tax evaded was worth ₹1,553 crore. "DGGI officers have detected total indirect tax evasion of ₹29,088 crore during April-October," the official said. On recovery of the evaded taxes, the official said that a total amount of ₹5,427 crore was realised during the seven-month period till October. These, he added, included recovery from previous cases and those detected during the current financial year.

New norms may gross up firms' assets, liabilities

The top 75 listed companies are likely to cumulatively recognise additional assets and liabilities worth over ₹1 lakh crore in their balance sheets once new accounting norms related to leasing are implemented, says a report. Leading consultancy EY has analysed the possible impact of Indian Accounting Standard (Ind AS) 116 mainly on the top 100 companies listed on the BSE. Ind AS 116 will replace Ind AS 17 from accounting periods starting April 1, 2019.

Sectors to be impacted The accounting standard is likely to have a significant impact on airline, retail and telecom sectors. "Balance sheets of top 75 Indian companies may be grossed up by over ₹1,00,000 crore on transitioning to new leasing standard Ind AS 116," EY said in a release. The annual reports of top 100 BSE companies, based on their market capitalisation, along with certain additional sector specific entities were analysed. EY noted that the objective was to understand the impact of Ind AS 116 on key financial metrics, including lease expense, interest cost, depreciation expense, earnings before interest, depreciation and tax (EBIDTA). The analysis highlighted that most of the companies across sectors are expected to have a significant impact on calculations related to property, plant and equipment and liabilities.

FPIs, DILs opt for contra bets in Q2

'PSBs, pharma will see higher interest'

The second quarter of the current financial year saw various instances of domestic and foreign portfolio investors (FPIs) taking contrarian bets on sectors such as banking, automobiles, gas distribution and pharmaceutical, among others.

While FPIs reduced their bet on large-cap private banks such as Yes Bank, ICICI Bank, Axis Bank and HDFC Bank, domestic institutional investors (DILs) increased exposure in majors such as ICICI Bank, Axis Bank and State Bank of India, according to a report by Edelweiss Securities. Further, companies such as Cipla, Vedanta, Jindal Steel & Power, TVS Motor Company, Britannia Industries, Yes Bank, ICICI Bank, Axis Bank and Hindustan Zinc, among others, also saw significant change in the institutional holding during the second quarter with many witnessing contrarian stance by FPIs and DILs.

The three-month period between July and September saw FPIs selling Indian shares worth \$1 billion even as domestic equity schemes registered robust flows. "Unrelenting flows into domestic equity schemes [approximately \$3.98 billion in July-September quarter] resulted into strong buying by mutual funds in secondary market during this period. However, FII flows continued to be soft with

net selling of \$1 billion in the aforesaid quarter," stated the report by the domestic brokerage entity. ICICI Bank and Yes Bank saw FPI holding fall by 118 basis points (bps) and 300 bps respectively, while the former saw DII stake go up by 174 bps in the second quarter.

Patterns seen gas firms Another sector where the contrarian stance of FPIs and DILs was clearly visible was gas distribution. FPIs raised their stake in Indraprastha Gas and GAIL by 103 bps and 132 bps, while Petronet LNG saw the foreign holding go up by 82 bps. But, DILs reduced their stake in Indraprastha Gas and GAIL by 56 bps and 115 bps, respectively. Similarly, Petronet LNG saw a dip of 16bps in the DII stake.

Interestingly, firms such as AU Small Finance Bank, Hexaware Technologies, Tejas Networks and L&T Infotech, Mahanagar Gas saw a rise in the holding of both, FPIs and DILs in the September quarter. South Indian Bank, Jaiprakash Associates, Balrampur Chini Mills and Dish TV India registered a dip in the FPI and DII stake in the second quarter. The coming quarters could see institutional investors shifting from retail-focused lenders to corporate lenders while allocating higher funds towards public sector banks and pharmaceuticals, said Edelweiss.

be premature, unjust and unfair to recommend any action against Johri on the basis of material placed before us.

"In our considered opinion he may be allowed to function as CEO of BCCI as before. No adverse action need to be taken against Rahul Johri, CEO, BCCI, on the basis of these mischievous, false, fabricated, unsubstantiated complaints, e-mails, tweets, etc. on social media," said the report.

Moots counselling

Gowda, who is also an external member of the BCCI's internal committee for sexual harassment, however, questioned the probity of the top professional manager of the BCCI, saying: "The conduct of Rahul Johri at Birmingham, as a CEO of an institution such as BCCI, is unprofessional and inappropriate which would adversely affect its reputation."

Gowda, who agreed that she had not found him guilty, made some serious re-

commendations in the matter.

"In view of his conduct at Birmingham as well as keeping in mind the allegations made by Ms. X, and his conduct before this Committee with respect to the photographs submitted, it is essential that Johri undergo some form of gender sensitivity counselling/training."

Edulji's opinion

Alluding to Gowda's recommendation, Edulji expressed the view that the report of the committee is actually a split 2-1 verdict and Johri

should be asked to resign with immediate effect.

Reacting to the decision, a former senior functionary of the BCCI said: "Is this not good enough? Ms. Gowda's remarks are scathing. She has talked about the BCCI reputation being adversely affected."

A point of view expressed by the BCCI officials is: "Edulji has the same right as Rai. The Supreme Court has not given executive powers to Rai alone. There is a clear divide: Rai wants Johri to resume duties and Edulji wants him to go."

‘Toughest period’

The story of the third day was a remarkable turnaround in form fashioned by Sasi Kumar Mukund against the higher-ranked No. 6 seed



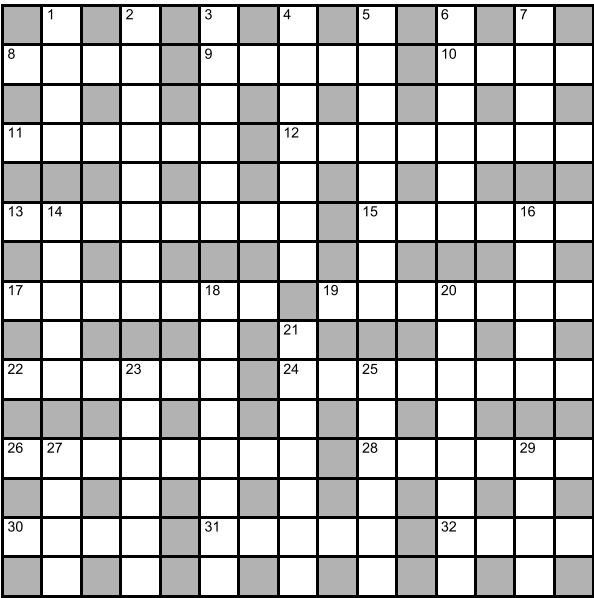

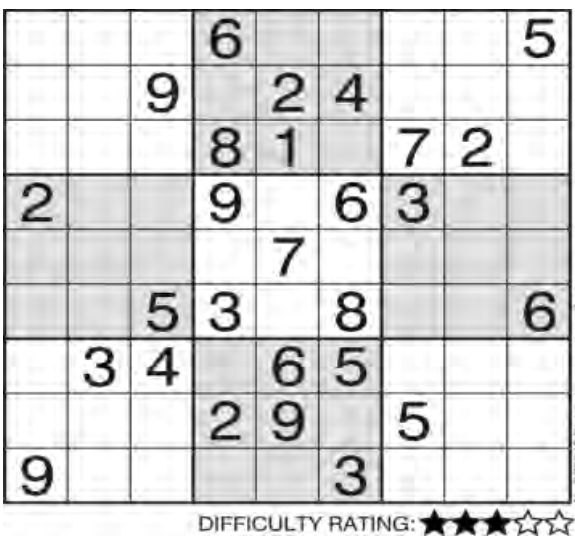

Tulsi saved his life

Srimad Bhagavatam says that it is far better to use tulsi leaves than sandal paste for worship of Lord Narayana, said P.T. Seshadri in a discourse. There is a story in the Narada Purana that brings out the greatness of tulsi. In a village, there lived a Brahmin called Madhava. He had never done any good deeds in his life or observed any rituals. He had some lands, which he cultivated. Everyday, he brought grass for his cows when he returned home.
One evening, he accidentally cut some tulsi leaves along with the grass. He was destined to die that evening and a snake came slithering towards him to bite him and end his life at the predetermined time. But it could not bite him because he had tulsi leaves in his hand. The man picked up the bundle of grass, together with the tulsi leaves, and placed the bundle on his head and went home. The snake hid itself in the bundle, hoping to bite him when he laid it down. Near Madhava's house lived Madhusudana, a very pious man. Through his powers, he realised that there was a snake in Madhava's grass bundle. He could even see the Yamadhutas shadowing Madhava to take away his life the moment he was bitten by the snake. Madhusudana asked the Yamadhutas how to save Madhava's life. The Yamadhutas replied, "We know that you do tulsi puja every day. If you transfer to Madhava the benefits of your tulsi puja for today, then he can be saved." 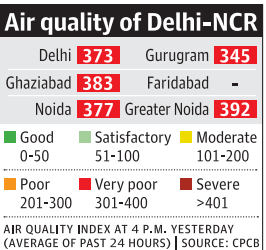

Zonal offices deserted as autos flock back to Burari

CM had on Nov 4 directed Transport Dept to allow issuance of fitness certificates from the facility; had termed it 'den of corruption' earlier

The Burari Transport Authority, dubbed a "den of corruption" by Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal earlier this year and on the brink of ceasing to exist in its current form, will survive after all as per his own directions.

In fact, after Mr. Kejriwal's directions to this effect at a review meeting to assess on-going projects under the purview of the Transport Department earlier this month, the authority located in north Delhi is back as the preferred location for the Capital's autorickshaw drivers to obtain fitness certificates, which can also be obtained at their local Regional Transport Offices (RTOs).

"On November 4, the Chief Minister simply directed the Department to allow, once again, the issuance of fitness certificates from the facility in addition to allowing the same at RTOs. There was no discussion on the rea-

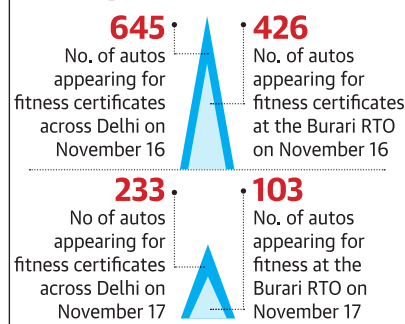
sons behind the change in stance," said a government source. The issuance of certification recommenced from November 15.

"Just after the decision to allow auto fitness at Burari, zonal offices [RTOs] wore a deserted look as a majority of autorickshaws flocked back to Burari; several efforts made by the Department in line with his previous wish regarding decentralisation such as software changes, posting of additional staff to check touts and infrastructure re-arrangement over two months have come to naught," the source said further.

Mr. Kejriwal had after his July 17 visit issued directions and set tight deadlines for the Department to formulate a proposal to decentralise core services being offered at the Burari Transport Authority.

The directions were issued after visitors complained of long queues to

BJP wants to eliminate Chief Minister, says Sisodia

Alleges man who attacked Kejriwal works for the Opposition party; AAP workers hold demonstration

A day after Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal was attacked by a man as he walked out of his office in the Delhi Secretariat, Deputy Chief Minister and Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) leader Manish Sisodia alleged on Wednesday that the leadership of the Bharatiya Janata Party (BJP) had planned the incident.

Mr. Kejriwal was attacked on Tuesday afternoon by a man who, on the pretext of conveying a grievance, lunged at the Chief Minister, breaking his glasses. He also attempted to smear red chilli powder on his face. The attacker, identified as Anil Kumar Sharma, was arrested.

Addressing a press conference at the AAP office here, Mr. Sisodia said the police initially said the chilli powder may have fallen accidentally

during the commotion. However, CCTV footage showed it was indeed an attack, he said.

"Union Home Minister Rajnath Singh called the Chief Minister and asked him to file a police complaint. I find it surprising that they expect the Chief Minister to give a complaint when the incident happened in the presence of the police," Mr. Sisodia said. The Delhi Police

took suo-motu cognisance of the matter and lodged an FIR late on Tuesday.

Citing posts targeting the AAP and Mr. Kejriwal, Mr. Sisodia said the accused in his Facebook profile identified himself as working with the BJP. "The attacker is a BJP worker... The top leadership of the BJP was behind the incident. The BJP is conspiring to have Mr. Kejriwal murdered," he said.

Mr. Sisodia pointed out that this was the fourth attack on the Chief Minister, who has had shoes and ink hurled at him at public events. "The police have failed to file chargesheets in any of the cases. On the other hand, if there is an allegation against any AAP MLA or Minister, they are quick to investigate and file charges-

heets," he said.

Mr. Sisodia also alleged that the BJP-led Central government was trying to stop the AAP government from working, by issuing orders and using investigations. However, they had failed, he said. "Now, they are trying to stop us by having Mr. Kejriwal murdered," he added.

While Mr. Sisodia declined to say what the AAP would do, sources said the party was seeking legal opinion on this matter and on the pending chargesheets in the previous attacks.

AAP leaders and workers also staged a demonstration near the BJP headquarters on Wednesday to protest against the party and the Delhi Police. AAP spokesperson and Greater Kailash MLA Saurabh Bharadwaj said the police were a "biased force" that was protecting "lunatics and anti-social elements".

Chilli powder attack: CM alleges conspiracy

'Rivals unhappy with AAP's work'

Kejriwal attack accused sent to judicial custody

Police to probe his background to ascertain motive, immediate trigger for action

A day after he was arrested for attacking Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal inside the Delhi Secretariat, accused Anil Sharma was produced before the court on Wednesday and sent to judicial custody for 14 days.

Sources said that the accused was incoherent and his background would therefore be probed to ascertain the issues, if any, he was grappling with and the motive and immediate trigger for the Tuesday's attack. "The team working on the case will check his background and speak to his family. The people he was living with in Delhi will also be questioned," said a senior

police officer.

Mr. Sharma has given two addresses to the police, one which he claimed was of his family in a village near Allahabad and another of the paying guest accommodation in west Delhi, where he claims to have been living for

the last two months. "A team will be sent to his village to speak to his family members to ascertain if he had any issues," the officer said.

Asked if Mr. Sharma has revealed details of his plan, sources said he could not explain when and how he planned the attack. "It is important to ascertain why he suddenly planned it. For this, a background check needs to be done," the officer said.

After an interrogation, the accused was produced before Duty Magistrate Neeti Suri Mishra at the Tis Hazari courts. The police pleaded that he be sent to judicial custody. Opposing the judicial remand plea, counsel for the accused submitted that

there was no charge against his client and he should, therefore, be released on bail. However, the court refused to consider the bail plea, stating that the address of the accused and his documents were yet to be verified.

Mr. Sharma is likely to file a bail application on Thursday.

During interrogation, Mr. Sharma claimed that he had tried to meet Kejriwal one-and-a-half-years ago but after he could not meet him, he broke the glass panes in the reception area of Delhi Secretariat, the police said. They said they will be verifying his claims and are further probing the matter.

'Stop compensation for Delhi Police martyrs'

AAP MLAs' demand comes on a day CM handed over cheque to BSF martyr's kin

Aam Aadmi Party (AAP) MLAs on Wednesday asked Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal to exclude Delhi Police personnel from the government policy that gives ₹1 crore compensation to the families of martyrs.

Several AAP MLAs signed the letter to the Chief Minister on a day he was in Haryana to hand over a ₹1 crore cheque to the family of Border Security Force jawan Narendra Singh, who was killed along the Pakistan border earlier this year.

The MLAs said that since the Delhi Police had failed to protect the Chief Minister, who has been attacked four times in two years, they

should not be a part of the AAP government's policy. The latest of the attacks happened on Tuesday, when a man lunged at Mr. Kejriwal and tried to smear red chilli powder on his face as he walked out of his office in the Delhi Secretariat.

In a tweet, AAP spokes-

person and one of the MLAs, who signed the letter, Saurabh Bharadwaj, said: "AAP MLAs have demanded Delhi Govt to exclude Delhi Police from the list of departments who are rewarded with ₹1 crore. BJP treats Delhi Police like tissue paper, their MP Manoj Tiwari ridicules & slaps their officers. Let BJP take care of Delhi Police, they deserve each other. [sic]."

Compensation policy

The government's policy provides for ₹1 crore compensation to families of military, paramilitary and Delhi Police personnel who are killed on duty. The policy covers martyrs who are residents of Delhi as well as per-

sonnel killed in operations in Delhi.

Speaking in Sonapat, Mr. Kejriwal said Narendra Singh's case was not "fitting" in the government policy, which was changed by the Cabinet in July to include those paramilitary martyrs whose permanent address was recorded in Delhi when they joined service.

'Welfare measure'

Delhi Police Additional PRO Anil Mittal said: "It [compensation policy] is a welfare measure for police personnel who lose their lives in the line of duty. The grant of ₹1 crore was a decision taken by the Delhi government. Beyond that, we have no comments to offer."

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AAP leader nominated to Hindi Academy body

Pak toddler undergoes unusual heart surgery

City doctors carry out successful surgery on 14-month-old

NEW DELHI
A 14-month-old Pakistani child successfully underwent a complex unusual heart surgery at the city's Sir Ganga Ram Hospital. The infant was brought to the hospital with an inability to feed properly, was having recurrent chest infections and every crawling movement was interrupted due to breathlessness. He was not able to grow, weighing only 6.5 kg at the time of admission. Neeraj Aggarwal, paediatric cardiologist at Sir Ganga Ram Hospital said, "Our detailed work revealed that the left-sided blood-receiving chamber of the heart (left atrium) was hugely dilated, four times to the expected size [called giant left atrium], which was pressing on the nearby airway structures in the chest. Also there was a large hole between the lower chambers of heart [called ventricular septal defect], and the left-sided valve was leaking."

Challenging surgery
Raja Joshi, chairman, paediatric cardiac surgery at the hospital said, "It was a complex and challenging surgery. To the best of our knowledge, only a few cases of giant left atrium have been reported in children below

the age of two years. We operated the child in single stage, open heart surgery where hole was closed, valve was repaired and the giant left atrium was reduced in size. Available reports revealed that this was the largest size of left atrium for the age reported in world literature." The patient was extubated

in the operating room itself by the anaesthesia team headed by Dr. Reena Joshi. The patient was discharged on the seventh post operative day under the guidance of the paediatric cardiac surgery team. Mridul Aggarwal, paediatric cardiologist at the hospital said, "Giant left atrium is a rare entity in paediatric population, but carries a significant mortality risk. When the left atrium increases in size, it causes complications by compressing adjacent structures such as food pipe, spine, pulmonary vessels, etc. After surgery, these complications are resolved which happened in the case of our patient."

Major Abhishek Dwivedi had moved the High Court challenging the April 24, 2018, decision of the Integrated HQ of MoD (Army), Adjutant General's Branch, Directorate of Medical Services (Army) rejecting his premature resignation plea.

Matrimonial discord
In his plea, Major Dwivedi said there was a matrimonial discord with his wife due to which he was not in a position to keep a balance between his professional and personal life. He said his wife had initiated divorce proceedings in a family court in New Delhi. Major Dwivedi was commissioned in the Army on February 26, 2009, as a Substantive Captain and has



subsequently served in the rank of Major. Later he appeared in the NEET PG examination for the Advance/PG Courses for Armed Forces Medical College Officers for 2013-16 session.

Sign undertaking
As he was selected for the subject of radio diagnosis, he was asked to sign and accept an undertaking which detailed the service/financial liability in the event he seeks premature resignation from the service. This at the time was a period of 10 years from the date of completion of the advanced degree course and a sum of about ₹15 lakh (mi-

IRCTC told to pay man ₹45,000 for cancelling 3 reserved tickets

Rly body had cancelled tickets based on third party's email

NEW DELHI

A district consumer disputes redressal forum here has directed the Indian Railways Catering and Tourism Corporation (IRCTC) to compensate a complainant by paying over ₹45,000 after the passenger's tickets were cancelled without his knowledge. Observing that the IRCTC had cancelled the tickets based on a third party's email, without the passenger's knowledge, the consumer panel said that refunding the ticket price was not enough. "On perusal of the submission of the parties, it is admitted by [IRCTC] that they have cancelled the reserved tickets on the behest of one Rohit Sharma and the cancellation request was not made by the complainant. Simply by refunding the cancellation money to the complainant is not suffice, as there was a clear deficient in services on part of [IRCTC] in our opinion," the consumer panel held.



The passenger had to book air tickets that cost them over ₹20,000.

It was alleged by complainant Sushovan Gupta Ray that despite having reserved tickets for his family from Sealdah to New Delhi, on the date of journey, he found an email from IRCTC stating the three tickets had been cancelled. "On enquiry, he came to know that one Rohit Sharma requested to cancel the reservation ticket through email. It is stated by complainant that he does not know any Rohit Sharma and due to cancellation of railway ticket he could not undergo the

journey as scheduled," the consumer panel observed. It was further alleged that due to the cancellation, the passengers had to book air tickets, that cost them over ₹20,000. **IRCTC contends** However, the IRCTC contended that there was no deficiency on their part, as following verification the cancellation charge was refunded to the complainant. "After considering the case of the complainant as a genuine [case], an amount of ₹3,450 was transferred in the account of the complainant. It is argued by the complainant that although refund was made by [IRCTC], still he is entitled for the compensation and litigation expenses on account of mental agony suffered by him as well as on account of the financial loss incurred," the panel observed. The consumer forum has awarded a compensation of ₹15,000 towards compensation for mental agony and ₹10,000 as litigation cost.

A senior officer said the victim's mother, a resident of a camp in Rajokri, called the police control room around 1.30 a.m. after she spotted the accused lying next to her daughter and touching her inappropriately.

"Accused Mahender is a tempo driver and was drunk at the time of the incident. He lives close to the victim's house. He came and lay down next to the girl. The girl's mother saw him and called him out," the officer said.

The mother, who works as house help, raised an alarm. Hearing her cries for help, the accused fled. The police said the accused is married.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (South-West) Devender Arya said a case has been registered under Section 354 of the Indian Penal Code and relevant sections of the Prevention of Children from Sexual Offences Act.

"Teams have been formed to nab him," Mr. Arya said.

Somnath booked for abusing scribe during live TV debate

Says he will file defamation case against Noida-based Hindi news channel and scribe; journalist says he called her an agent of the BJP

NOIDA Aam Aadmi Party MLA Somnath Bharti landed in fresh controversy on Wednesday after he was booked for allegedly hurling abuses at an anchor with a Hindi news channel during a live television debate.

Calling her a "BJP agent" and making an objectionable remark against her, Mr. Bharti later accused the TV channel of "misusing" its power.

A senior police officer said a first information report has been lodged against the Malviya Nagar MLA under Sections 504 (intentional insult with intent to provoke breach of the peace) and 509 (word, gesture or act intended to insult the modesty of a woman) of the Indian Penal Code in Noida following a complaint by the woman journalist.

The complaint was lodged by the scribe at the Women Police Station here. The police said the case has been handed over to a senior Investigating Officer.

"We will record the statements of both parties. We have asked the complainant to share all details related to the matter," the officer added.



The woman said in her complaint, "During a live TV debate, Mr. Bharti hurled abuses at me... I am a journalist and aware of the responsibility when I asked the question, but he abused and called me an agent of the BJP. He threatened to get our channel shut down. The kind of words he used for a woman, they were offensive and demeaning."

However, Mr. Bharti said he will file a defamation case against the news channel and the anchor.

The AAP MLA said he had joined the TV debate over telephone to discuss the chilli powder attack on Delhi Chief Minister Arvind Kejriwal on Tuesday but the video presented by the channel was "manipulated". Stating that the channel had "misused" its power to file a case against him, Mr. Bharti told journalists it was "unfortunate" that a channel whose

Delhi BJP slams Somnath Bharti; AAP, Maliwal disapprove of MLAs behaviour

NEW DELHI Leader of the Opposition in the Delhi Assembly Vijender Gupta on Wednesday demanded registration of an FIR against Somnath Bharti, even as Delhi BJP chief Manoj Tiwari questioned the party choosing to remain "mum" over the AAP MLA's use of "uncivilised and objectionable words" against a female TV journalist in Noida.

Mr. Gupta said, "Where are the Chief Minister [Arvind Kejriwal], the AAP leaders and Delhi Commission for Women chief Swati Maliwal who clamour for women's rights now? What action has she [Ms. Maliwal] taken against Mr. Bharti so far? We demand an FIR be registered against him for using vulgar and abusive language against a female TV anchor, and strict action against him by the party."

'Fake chilli attack' The AAP, Mr. Tiwari said on Wednesday, had immediately blamed the BJP for the "fabricated chilli powder attack" on Mr. Kejriwal outside

his office in the Delhi Secretariat on Tuesday but chose to remain "mum" over the Somnath Bharti incident.

Mr. Tiwari said Tuesday's "attack" on the Chief Minister belonged to its "very old modus operandi" aimed at "getting sympathy" before the elections.

"When I learnt about the [chilli powder] incident on Tuesday, I strongly condemned it via the digital platform within 15 minutes. But after the AAP held the BJP responsible for the incident, it is now necessary to reveal the modus operandi of Mr. Kejriwal, who runs the party with money earned by sinful acts," Mr. Tiwari said at a press conference here.

"This method of getting sympathy [employed by Mr. Kejriwal] is very old. Whenever the Lok Sabha or Assembly elections are to be held, such incidents happen with him," he added.

For instance, the North-East Delhi MP argued, before the Assembly elections on November 18, 2013, a man threw black paint on Mr. Kejriwal; before the Lok Sabha

elections on March 5, 2014, somebody threw stones at his car; on March 25, 2015, ink and eggs were thrown at him in Varanasi.

Similarly, on March 28, 2014, Mr. Kejriwal was slapped in Haryana; and on April 4, 2014; April 8, 2014; December 26, 2014 and before elections in four States on January 17, 2016, ink and eggs were thrown on the Chief Minister, the Delhi BJP chief said.

"The Chief Minister has staged this fabricated attack to divert attention from the

fatal attack on me by AAP MLA Amanatullah Khan and the use of objectionable words by Mr. Bharti against a female journalist," Mr. Tiwari alleged.

While Deputy Chief Minister Manish Sisodia held a press conference soon after the alleged attack on Mr. Kejriwal, where the BJP was blamed for it, he "remained mum" on the "insult to a female journalist and the daughter of the country" by Mr. Bharti, he added.

AAP, Maliwal react Meanwhile, the AAP said later that it disapproved of Mr. Bharti's alleged behaviour. "Mr. Bharti should not have talked the way he did on television," AAP spokesperson Saurabh Bhardwaj said. In a late tweet, Ms. Maliwal said: "I strongly condemn Somnath Bharti's misogynistic and shameful statements against a female reporter. I believe NOIDA Police has filed an FIR in the matter. Law shall now take its course. I strongly feel people in public life should control their anger! [sic]"

Brothers held for cheating

Took ₹2 crore from victim for property not owned by them

NOIDA Two brothers, residents of Gurugram, were arrested by the on Tuesday night for allegedly duping a resident of Delhi running a business in Noida in 2009, the police said on Wednesday.

The accused said that the accused, Amit and Aman Sayal, had duped the victim of more than ₹2 crore on the pretext of selling him a property, which was not even registered in their name.

"They had provided the victim, Sudhir Gupta, with fake documents pertaining

to the property. The victim owned a property in Sector 6 and had showed interest in an adjacent property, which the accused claimed to own," said Manoj Kumar Pant, Station House Officer, Sector 20 police station.

The police said that the victim paid the amount to the accused in instalments and was also provided with fake ownership documents. However, when the victim went to the Noida Authority to complete the registration, they found that the property was not owned by the accused.

"A case had been registered in this regard and a non-bailable warrant was issued for the accused by the district court," said a senior police officer.

The police also said that the accused had been involved in cases of fraud. About 37 cases have been identified so far against them all over India, including Hyderabad, Mumbai, Delhi, Gujarat. The police also said that whenever the victims would approach the accused and demand their money back they would get assaulted by bouncers.

Gang busted for loan fraud

NEW DELHI The police have busted a gang allegedly involved in cheating people on the pretext of providing loan on '0%' interest, said the police on Wednesday.

The accused have been identified as Manoj Kumar, Rahul Sharma and Tarun Rastogi. They operated a fake call centre to contact potential customers. The police have recovered 34 mobile handsets and 41 SIM cards from the accused.

The police said the complainant had received a call in July. The caller told the victim that he was from a

bank offering loan at '0%' interest.

The complainant agreed to avail a loan. The caller asked for his PAN and Aadhaar Card details, which the complainant provided. Thereafter, the caller asked for ₹10,000 as security money to sanction a loan of ₹5 lakh. The complainant transferred the amount into the account provided by the caller. The caller duped the complainant to the tune of ₹1,44,866 in six transaction on the one pretext or the other. Thereafter, the caller switched off his mobile. A case was registered at Crime Branch police station.

"Police team working on the case arrested Manoj and Rahul on November 14 from their fake call centre in Kirti Nagar. The accused would ask the victims to transfer the money into their bank accounts. All SIM cards recovered were obtained using fake IDs," said Additional CP (Crime) A.K. Singla.

During investigation, the arrested told the police that Tarun Rastogi provided the SIM cards obtained using fake IDs. He was also arrested. "Tarun used to purchase one SIM card for ₹250 and sell it to Manoj and Rahul for ₹500," said Mr. Singla added.

Driver held for killing senior citizen

Accused worked in the same society where the victim lived, say police

A 51-year-old man has been arrested for allegedly killing a 73-year-old woman at her residence in south-east Delhi's Sarita Vihar last week, the police said on Wednesday.

Deputy Commissioner of Police (South-East) Chinmoy Biswal said that the accused has been identified as Mehboob, a resident of Madanpur Khadar, who used to work as a driver in the same society where the victim, Savitri Pandey, used to reside with her husband Radha Kishan Pandey.

Ms. Pandey was found with her throat slit on November 17. Her son, a chartered accountant, who lives in an accommodation behind the victim's house, and neighbours rushed her to a nearby hospital where she was declared dead. Mr. Pandey had stepped out to meet a friend when the incident happened.

Mr. Biswal said the family was asked about all their domestic helps and people they were in regular contact with. "It's a gated colony, therefore it had to be a person who had easy access to the colony," Mr. Biswal said.

Over 15 teams working on the case scanned CCTV footage of the entire area because the camera installed outside the victim's residence was not working. "Over 100 persons were questioned and movement of all

the domestic helps in touch with the victim's family was monitored," the officer said. The family, during questioning, mentioned that the driver of a neighbour also got in touch with them about 15 days ago on the pretext of giving them a letter. "He went inside the house to conduct a recce on the pretext of giving an envelop which was later found empty. For a possibility to come again, he left his helmet there," the officer said.

Mohit, a resident of Hari Nagar in Ashram, had come to attend a marriage function in Sunlight Colony. An argument broke out between two men - Himanshu and Arthur - after their hands brushed against each

other while dancing. The argument turned ugly after which Mohit intervened.

However, Himanshu and his friend Gaurav got into an altercation with Mohit, following which Himanshu stabbed Mohit in the chest. They fled after stabbing him.

Join social media to facilitate citizens lodge complaints directly'

Actions of public and enforcement agencies have been inadequate: CPCB

The Central Pollution Control Board (CPCB) has directed public and enforcement agencies to immediately join social media platforms on which citizens can lodge their pollution-related complaints directly, noting that actions of these bodies have been "inadequate".
The directions have been made to the North Delhi Municipal Corporation, the South Delhi Municipal Corporation (SDMC), the East Delhi Municipal Corporation (EDMC), the Delhi Metro Rail Corporation (DMRC), the Central Public Works Department (CPWD), the Delhi Development Authority (DDA), and State pollution control boards of Delhi, Rajasthan, Haryana, Punjab and Uttar Pradesh, among other public bodies.
In a meeting with public agencies and State pollution control boards, CPCB member Secretary Prashant Gargava asked the agencies to join social media platforms like Twitter and Facebook to

facilitate citizens on lodging of complaints on air-polluting activities.
"It has been observed that most of the agencies are yet to join social media platforms and take action in respect of complaints concerning them," the CPCB was quoted as saying, as per the minutes of the meeting that took place last week.
The CPCB said that the reported complaints are forwarded to the concerned agencies for action, however "it is observed that most of the agencies are yet to join and also action taken on complaints are inadequate".
"It was reiterated that agencies must immediately create Facebook page and Twitter handle to join CPCB social media platform to address complaints," it said, adding that the action-taken response must also be posted on the same platform through which complaints are received.
Ensure corrective action
Mr. Gargava directed representatives of agencies to en-

directly to be acted upon by the task force responsible for implementation of the Grad-ed Response Action Plan (GRAP).
Delhi has been battling alarming levels of pollution for over a month due to regional factors like stubble burning and localised factors like pollution from vehicles, firecrackers, construction activities among others, following which a number of steps were taken by the CPCB to check air pollution.
On Monday, Supreme Court-appointed Environment Pollution Control Authority Chairperson Bhure Lal also lashed out at enforcement agencies, alleging that Delhi's civic and urban bodies are "not properly implementing" the directions issued to curb pollution.
He said enforcing agencies were "completely dormant" and bodies like the Delhi Development Authority (DDA) and the Municipal Corporation of Delhi (MCD) were indulging in a blame game.

Sealing: SC to pronounce order on contempt proceedings today

Against Manoj Tiwari for allegedly breaking seal of property

The Supreme Court is scheduled to pronounce on Thursday its order on contempt proceedings against Delhi BJP chief and Lok Sabha MP Manoj Tiwari for allegedly breaking the seal of a premises here. The property had been sealed by the East Delhi Municipal Corporation (EDMC).
A Bench headed by Justice Madan B. Lokur was on October 30 reserved its order after hearing arguments in the matter, during which Mr. Tiwari had accused the court-mandated monitoring committee on sealing of "terrorising" people of Delhi. The panel, however, had claimed that he was trying to make the court a "political battleground".
An FIR was also lodged against Mr. Tiwari by the EDMC for allegedly breaking the seal of the property in north-east Delhi's Gokalpuri on September 16.

After taking note of a report filed by the monitoring committee – that the BJP leader had broken the seal of the property – the apex court had on September 19 issued a contempt notice against the North-East Delhi MP. Mr. Tiwari had claimed before the top court that the monitoring committee has exceeded its jurisdiction and conducted the sealing drive in unauthorised colonies here that were protected under the law.
Senior counsel Vikas Singh, appearing for the BJP leader, had claimed before the Bench that "monitoring committee wanted to terrorise the people of Delhi. This is only for publicity".
Countering his arguments, advocate A.D.N. Rao, appearing for the committee, had said the panel does not need any "publicity" and its members were "only performing their jobs entrusted to them by the Supreme Court".
Mr. Tiwari's counsel had said that a mob of around 1,500 people had gathered at the spot and if the BJP leader would not have broken the seal in "token protest"

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Countering his arguments, advocate A.D.N. Rao, appearing for the committee, had said the panel does not need any "publicity" and its members were "only performing their jobs entrusted to them by the Supreme Court".
Mr. Tiwari's counsel had said that a mob of around 1,500 people had gathered at the spot and if the BJP leader would not have broken the seal in "token protest"

an untoward incident could have happened there. He had also argued that there was no violation of the top court order in the matter, as projected by the committee. The top court had earlier ordered restoration of its 2006 monitoring committee to identify and seal unauthorised structures in Delhi.
The monitoring committee, comprising K.J. Rao, former adviser to the Election Commission; Bhure Lal, chairperson of Environment Pollution (Prevention and Control) Authority; and Major-General (retd) Som Jhingan, was set up on March 24, 2006, by the top court.

IT WAS 50 YEARS AGO TODAY...

The India-inspired *White Album* was released by The Beatles half-a-century ago on November 22. A look at the Fab Four’s time in Rishikesh, where most of the songs were written

It was 1968, the era of the Beatles. Their superhit ‘psychedelic’ album *Sgt Pepper’s Lonely Hearts Club Band* had just been released and was all the rage among teenagers in Britain at the time. The catchy lyrics remain embedded in my mind: *It was 20 years ago today, Sergeant Pepper taught the band to play; They’ve been going in and out of style, But they’re guaranteed to raise a smile.*

I left school in England and travelled to take up a post as a volunteer-teacher in Dehradun. As a teenager myself, imagine my joy to find that the Beatles were to arrive at nearby Rishikesh to begin several weeks of transcendental meditation. The technique’s exponent, Maharishi Mahesh Yogi from Varanasi, who had become popular in Britain and California, invited the Beatles and other celebrities to his Rishikesh ashram. These included actress Mia Farrow, Mike Love of the Beach Boys, the singer Donovan, known as ‘the Scottish (Bob) Dylan’, and flautist Paul Horn.

In those days, Dehradun was a pleasant and quaint town in Uttar Pradesh, renowned for its institutions – the Indian Military Academy, Forest Research Institute and the Survey of India – and as a stopping-off point en route to the hill station of Mussoorie. Pedestrians and cyclists like me knew the narrow main street really well, which leads West from the distinctive six-sided clock tower, as ‘suicide alley’ – for obvious reasons. Now, the city has grown in stature to become

the capital of Uttarakhand.

A little help from friends

I got to know Ajit Singh, the owner of Dehradun’s Pratap Music House, which was supplying The Beatles with Indian musical instruments. My lucky break came when Ajit received an order from George Harrison to make a *dilruba* for his wife Pattie on her birthday. Ajit invited me and fellow volunteer-teacher, Steve Browne, to travel to Rishikesh to deliver the instrument – our role was to carry Pattie’s birthday cake from a Dehradun bakery. Delivering cake and present meant staying on for the birthday party.

My visit to the ‘Valley of Saints’ remains vivid. Rishikesh, with its numerous ashrams, is famous as a centre of meditation and is the gateway to the shrine town of Badrinath. It is regarded as the place where the sacred Ganga enters the plains through a gorge from its Himalayan source. We crossed the Ganga over the elegant Lakshman Jhula footbridge, where monkeys hover. We climbed the steep bank on the opposite side and, passing scrutiny by guards, were admitted to the Maharishi’s extensive and exclusive ashram, surrounded on three sides by thick jungle and on the fourth by the river.

Music in the air

We were not invited (or required) to join the twice-daily meditation sessions, but participated in informal open-air mingling and singing. During the afternoon, which seemed to be rest time, songs wafted from the bungalows where the

that “the *White Album* is turbulent, raw and challenging – partly in reaction to the political upheaval at the end of the 1960s, as the Vietnam War and the assassination of Martin Luther King Jr crushed the idealism of the Summer of Love”. Students were rioting in Paris and the Soviet army had invaded Czechoslovakia to quell the Prague Spring uprising.

Indian music first appeared on the previous album, *Sgt Pepper’s Lonely Hearts Club Band*, in George Harrison’s melody ‘Within You Without You’ which begins with a delightful sitar solo. Harrison had taken lessons from his musical guru, Ravi Shankar, on a previous visit to India.

The *White Album* tracks were loosely based on the Beatles’ stay at Rishikesh. ‘The Continuing Story of Bungalow Bill’ told the story of the American son of an aide to the Maharishi, who secretly set out on a hunting expedition in the surrounding jungle and ended up killing a tiger – “in self-defence”, he claimed. The killing did not go down well at the strictly-vegetarian ashram. Paul McCartney wrote ‘Blackbird’ about the noisy crows which disturbed morning meditation sessions, though later he said the song was about race relations in America. ‘Mother Nature’s Son’, also by Paul, was based on a lecture the Maharishi had given about man’s relationship with Nature. John Lennon’s overtly political song, ‘Revolution’, was inspired by protests in many cities against the Vietnam War. Donovan’s own hit song, the ballad ‘Jennifer Juniper’, was inspired by his infatuation for Pattie Harrison’s younger sister, Jenny, who was also at the ashram.

Though I did not know it at the time, I was hearing raw versions of some of these songs. Rishikesh was

In step with swans

As Sharmila Mukerjee makes Tchaikovsky’s swans twirl to Odissi, the seasoned exponent says the dance form’s grace lends itself naturally to the theme

Translations bring literatures, cultures and people closer, the same way that an adaptation would. In that sense, adaptations are also works of translation, only with familiar contexts and magnified imaginations. “Swan Lake” is inarguably a timeless piece of work, an all-consuming one at that. It was and continues to remain a dream-work for any ballet dancer, something that would often prove one’s merit as a dancer. But what also sets “Swan Lake” apart is the parallels of its scenes and contexts with stories from India, starting with the swan, an ideal symbol of love. It is but befitting that this tremendous story gets adapted into Odissi, the dance of lasya. One can’t but agree that the dance form’s grace lends itself naturally to the theme.

Sharmila Mukerjee kept her fascination for “Swan Lake” intact until it was time. An Odissi dancer trained under renowned exponent Poushali Mukerjee and the iconic Kelucharan Mohapatra, Mukerjee’s adaptation of “Swan Lake”, titled “Hansika” is a production to watch out for. After premiering in Bengaluru, “Hansika”

is all set to be showcased in Delhi this evening by Mukerjee and her ensemble. Says Mukerjee, “I was always fascinated by ‘Swan Lake’. Growing up, I saw more pictures of ballet than of the Indian classical dances. The Indian dances

came later in my life. The story of ‘Swan Lake’ is visually so appealing. The movement of *hamsa* in Odissi is somewhat a natural one within the grammar. I had read the story a long time ago, and I always thought it could be done in

Odissi.” With a cast of 25 dancers, all of which are her students except one, “Hansika” is yet another effort on Mukerjee’s part to move beyond the traditional repertoire. Mukerjee understands that such a

theme requires paying attention to nuances in order to make it appealing. Keeping the theme of Pyotr Tchaikovsky’s music, Hansika’s music has been composed by Praveen D Rao. A whole range of Indian instruments used in Odissi like mardala, sitar, tabla and pakhawaj have been used in the music for this Indian dance ballet. “Essentially, the emotions are the same. There is love, jealousy, anger, sorcery, and drama. I did not have the courage to take it up for a long time because it is a huge production to be carried out. I knew it cannot be done with six or seven dancers and it would need at least a star cast of about 25 dancers. But somewhere I developed it and thought it would all fall in place,” says Mukerjee.

Hansika starts in raga Hamsadhvani and follows with a raga malika according to the changing scenes. “I needed to change the story a bit, but I did keep the original flavour. There are many versions and adaptations of the story as well. For instance, there is a ball room scene which could not be adapted to this production. Instead, there is a wedding ceremony with the traditional kumkum,

haldi etc.” says Mukerjee. Similarly, the famous dance scene between Odette and Odile will be portrayed in authentic Odissi grammar.

Mukerjee is a firm believer in experimenting with her art throughout. She says that as important as it is to dance the traditional items, one must not deter from adapting themes and concepts that are outside of it.

“I think all of us love our traditional *margams*. But this kind of a production has a bigger mass appeal and reaches a wider audience. Some of them might be new to the classical dance itself,” she says.

And it is only imperative for an artiste to understand the audience. “There will be all kinds of people in the audience and we should not take them for granted to be of one type, which is why it is important to reach out. We cannot expect everybody to understand everything that we do, and keep it limited to a niche audience. There will be divided opinions about a dance, it is inevitable,” sums up Mukerjee.

‘Hansika’ will be staged at Kamani Auditorium, 7p.m.)

No matter where you go, from Uganda to Tokyo, you are sure to find an Irish pub. Here's what makes them so popular

Some countries send you a signal to tell you that it's time to visit them. In the month of June, I trekked to 'the world's highest Irish Pub' at Namche Bazaar, Nepal. Climbing to the dizzy height of 3,440 metres was the hardest I had ever worked for a pint of beer. But then, an Irish Pub is no ordinary place, and finding one at such a remote place was no coincidence.

Shortly after that, I was at the birthplace of pub culture – Ireland. I was intrigued to know what makes an Irish pub so popular that pub crawls attract over 80% of the tourists coming to Ireland. There must be something special about them; otherwise, why would there be over 7,000 Irish pubs in over 53 countries, from Mongolia to Iraq,

Australia to Canada, Bolivia to Russia. Here is what I found after visiting pubs of all shapes, sizes, and styles.

Pubs are at the heart of Irish life

When it comes to a great pub, Ireland wrote the book. The public houses of the Emerald Isle have been at the centre of Irish life since the 10th Century. Nowhere in the world have pubs donned so many hats: funeral home, restaurant, grocery shop, music venue, job centre and a meeting place for everyone from poets to revolutionaries. Often basic and unpretentious, they are a home away from home.

A place to enjoy Irish 'craic'

"There are no strangers here, only friends you haven't yet met" – goes

the famous quote by Irish poet William Butler Yeats. With the evolution of time, they evolved into a global institution synonymous with hospitality, camaraderie and, most of all, community. As I sip on a glass of Guinness at Murphy's Bar in Killarney, Tom Kennedy, a local who runs Experience Ireland Golf and Travel, says, "One word really, the 'craic'! It's tough to quantify this: is it the people that frequent the pub or the atmosphere or the quality of the pint you are served? Is it live music, or the welcome you receive from the locals and staff, or that random stranger who will chat with you for hours at the bar about even more random topics? It's all of this really!"

More than just a place to chug pints of Guinness

It is here that conversations and camaraderie take over differences in age, nationality, and status. Sarah Dee, the Global Digital PR and

Content Marketing Head, Tourism Ireland, says, "The Irish pub is never just a place to grab a pint. It's the heart of the community, where family and friends come together. It's where local stories flourish and grow, where legends come to life. Interested in Titanic? How about meeting a ghost? Whatever you're into, here, there's a pub for that."

In a way, these watering holes are also talent incubators. Many great writers like James Joyce, Samuel Beckett, Oscar Wilde and Brendan Behan got their inspiration in literary bars. And, it's not just literature that has profited from the pub culture. Musicians and dancers too found unwavering support in these unusual institutions of creativity.

Whether you're a teetotaler or a beer-guzzler, Irish pubs should be part of your itinerary. After all, even Barack Obama couldn't resist visiting one, cracking a few jokes and raising a toast. Sláinte!

Oscar Wilde

"Fun, unfortunately, is so much fun."

I am at a corner of Merrion Square Park, Dublin, beside myself with excitement. Not just because it is a bright sunny day with blue skies and there are cobble streets everywhere, but because Oscar Wilde just called me.

Yes, that is right, he called me on my mobile and told me about his mother, "Jane 'Speranza' Wilde, poet and political provocateur, as preposterous as she was endearing, who loved me and was loyal to the last..." They almost put her in prison for writing seditious verse; imagine if they had – two jailbirds in one family!"

Easily my most favourite thing about Dublin were the talking statues. There are 12 of these across the city and they will all speak to you politely, if you want them to, in the voices of famous Irish writers and

television, stage and film personalities.

So I learn that Irish novelist John Banville has written the lines for Wilde, and Andrew Scott (remember Jim Moriarty in the BBC series *Sherlock*?) has lent him his voice. Wilde looks down at me as he sprawls on a rock and instructs me to look across the park fence where his home still stands. He was born there in 1854, he says. The sculptor of Oscar Wilde's remarkable statue is Danny Osborne, Irish of course. The pink collar of Wilde's shirt is

made of a semi-precious stone called thulite, brought all the way from Norway, along with the larvike that is his trousers, while the rest of his jacket is of shiny jade from Canada. His hands and proud head are of jade from Guatemala. His shoes are black granite.

I wave goodbye and giggle at his parting shot. He makes a snarky comment about his chief rival, George Bernard Shaw. "I used to call him Pshaw!"

GB Shaw

"Look at me! – with my best foot forward!"

George Bernard Shaw stands tall and elegant, arms crossed, at the National Gallery of Ireland. His life-sized statue was made by a close friend, Paolo Troubetzkoy. They say, like Shaw, the Russian artist too advocated vegetarianism. Troubetzkoy has sculpted three statues of Shaw. Irish comic writer Arthur Mathews and actor-writer Stephen Brennan are Shaw's voice. Shaw says, with feeling, that all he learned in Ireland was right here at the National Gallery. He so loved the place that he actually

bequeathed one-third of his royalties to the museum. So every time someone watches a performance of his plays, the National Gallery gets a little something from him. He describes the streets around the museum: "Oh! When I think of the history of these streets so close to where we are today... Men and women marching up and down; becoming agitated and excited at the political developments. The shouting, and the cheering, and the singing, and at night the drunks causing consternation. The dogs and children scurrying at their feet – unconcerned by the great debates raging in adult minds around them..." He mentions the first time he saw some famous paintings at this very gallery and I scurry off to see them: Titian, Canaletto, Velazquez and a Caravaggio. But first, I pose just like him and beg a fellow visitor at the museum to take my picture.

Molly Malone

"I never want for company. People can be a little too familiar with me though – not my fault I'm stuck in this dress."

If you venture out at night, you might meet her ghost. Molly Malone is a fishmonger who once sold cockles and mussels on the streets of Dublin. Today, her statue stands there with her wheelbarrow, not far from the river Liffey from where she got her catch. And, if you strain your ears, you can hear her story in her own words. The buxom Molly lived in the 17th Century and, while she sold fresh cockles and mussels from the sea during the day, they say she was a sex worker by night. The statue's bosom has an extra burnish, as most tourists can't keep their hands off her. Sadly, Molly got fever and died, and the song about her has become an anthem of sorts. She even has a day dedicated to her, June 13.

Sinéad O'Connor and U2 are some of the singers who have sung this song. Molly's statue was made by Irish sculptor Jeanne Rynhart to commemorate Dublin's millennium year in 1988. Irish musicians The Dubliners sang 'Molly Malone' at the function and Rynhart sang along with them. And by the way, the statue of Molly Malone speaks to you in the voice of Irish singer Maria Doyle Kennedy. Molly has moved around a bit, but now stands at the corner of Suffolk Street, not too far from the Tourist Office.

Hop on for a heady mix

Tales of Vembanad, a toddy-tasting tour, offers engaging activities to experience the lake differently

Tales of Vembanad, a new experiential tour designed by WanderNow, promises to turn a simple trip into a meaningful experience.

It explores the Vembanad Lake with a curated trip through Alappuzha and Kumarakom, providing real-life experiences, and helping tourists discover the lake through activities provided by the community that inhabits the banks.

"We have involved the local community who act as our guides and chefs. It is our initiative to help the people rebuild their lives after being hit severely by the devastating floods. The whole tour hinges on them, their homes, culture, food and support," says Nebu Sam John, co-founder, WanderNow.

The tour includes a heady

toddy-tasting session, complete with a demonstration of extraction and production.

"Like the popular beer or wine-tasting tours across the world, we have brought in toddy tasting. Toddy is a perfect 'social lubricant' and such a tour is the best way to meet people, party with your fellow travellers and locals, and enjoy folk songs and performances," says Nebu.

The tourists get a chance to watch toddy tappers climb up coconut trees, sometimes walking from one to the other on tightropes, in

search of budding flower stalks. They slice these stalks open and collect the liquid in mud pots; it almost immediately begins to ferment, turning it into a mildly alcoholic brew. This is then taken to the toddy shops, where one gets to experience lip-smacking food. There's a variety of fish, crab, mussel, duck, meat and more, offering the traveller a true taste of Kerala.

Other experiences include a day in a traditional canoe. Tourists sail through the canals, eat lunch on board; walk through the muddy paddy fields and meet with the villagers. They can also take a class on learning to make products from water hyacinth or spend a day painting shells with the guidance of local artists.

Tales of Vembanad was launched in September and had members of the Australian World Orchestra as its first guests. For Lucy, the coordinator of the orchestra, the tour provided a "lovely day, delicious food and an incredible experience." For Sagar, the only Indian member of the orchestra, the tour was a revelation. "I can't wait to come back. I really got the true Kerala experience."
